April 28 & May 2 Picture to Wall Hanging Kathy Bush

Fee: \$80 This class demonstrates a technique of taking a photograph or painting of your choice and creating a one-of-a-kind machine appliquéd, quilted wall-hanging. The process involves using the picture or painting (participants are responsible for obtaining copyright permission from original artist) to create a pattern, enlarge it to a desired size, mark it for construction purposes, and use paper backed fusible and fabrics of your choice to complete your design. This class is for the experienced quilter with an expectation that you already know how to use fusible web and how to finish and enhance a machine appliquéd project once it is fused to the background. It is basically a design and construction class that will require completion afterwards at home. Sewing machines will likely not be required. Photographs or painting choices must be approved prior to the class to ensure suitability.





May 30 Ice Dyeing Fabric Joy Hegglund Fee: \$95

Experience the magic of creating your own unique fabric. Ice dyeing is fascinating and fun. You are never really sure what your creation will look like but the results are fantastic. Fee includes 5 metres of fabric and all dyeing supplies.





Block of the Month

I hope everyone had a good Christmas. It sure is nice to spend time with family and friends although I did talk to some people who were looking forward to spending the time alone. There sure isn't just one way to enjoy the holidays.

This is a reminder that we will be working on the Disappearing Nine Patch which will be due at the January meeting. It's using 5" children's prints fabrics (4 light fabrics and 5 medium/dark fabrics). After sewing the nine patch, cut the block in half twice. You only have to flip 2 diagonal sections this time, turning the sections so two small blocks are in the center, touching diagonally. Check the picture

to make sure they are facing the right direction.

Disappearing Nine Patch

unfinished size 13"

Due: January 2020 meeting

Fabric: Children's fabric—5" squares 4 light, 5 contrasting fabric

- Sew squares to make a nine patch
- 2. Cut in half twice without moving fabrics
- 3. Turn 2 diagonal blocks
- 4. Sew back together





Baked Oatmeal (similar to that served at Homewood retreat)

for 9 x 9 tray double quantity 1/2 cup 1 cup 2 Tbsp

Sugar 1/2 cup 1 cup 2 Tbsp

Beaten eggs 2 4

Vanilla 2 tsp 4 tsp

Baking 1 tsp 1 1/4 Tbsp

powder

Oil

Cinnamon 2 tsp 4 tsp

Salt 1/2 tsp 1 tsp

Oats 3 cups 6 3/4 cups

Milk 1 cup 3 cups

Mix the oil, sugar, eggs and add the dry ingredients. Bake in a 9 x 9 pan at 350 F for about 20 minutes. Thanks to Carole Phinney for the Capernwray version of this recipe.


