Happy 2021 everyone! Fingers crossed there is a "light at the end of the tunnel" for 2021!

We have been carefully considering your questions about our library books since this pandemic started.

What should I do with my library books?

Answer: Please keep them until we are able to get together again. We don't have access to our Curling Club storage at the moment and I/we don't have the space to collect, store, or even worse, the strength to pack them all back to the Curling Club for the next meeting. We have **hundreds** of library materials checked out at any one time. You probably know how heavy 1 bag of books is, multiply that by 100 and you can imagine what a job it would be to collect, store and transport the materials. Our Library cupboards are only able to hold the remaining books after each meeting, not our whole collection of 900+ books plus magazines.

In the meantime, please "quarantine" your books in a plastic bag in a safe place and have them ready for the next meeting. If you are moving, hopefully you can leave them with another member for safe keeping. When BC Health eases their restrictions, we may be able to arrange a parking lot meet up with the Curling Club to return your library materials and store them with our other Guild cupboards. Right now that possibility remains up in the air.

Hope that answers the question, Thanks you all for keeping our Guild Library Collection safe. The Library Committee's work starts as soon as we are able to meet again.
