Placemats

Well I have to admit to some mathematical errors in my previous reporting of Placemat and Tea cozy numbers.

I discovered these when preparing the donation items at Christmas. We actually had 139 placemats and 18 tea cozies at the end of May 2023. We collected 10 at the Quilt show, 10 in July, 43 placemats and 12 tea cozies in Sept., 7 in October, and 33 placemats and 16 tea cozies in Nov. for a total of 242 placemats and 46 tea cozies in stock in November. In December we donated 125 placemats to Meals on Wheels Nanaimo, 13 to MOW Gabriola Island, 6 to MOW Ladysmith and 80 placemats and 40 tea cozies to the Salvation Army for their Christmas Hamper program. We had 1 placemat turned in at the Christmas Potluck.

We now have (and I counted them) 19 placemats and 6 tea cozies to start off the new year. So, well done and thanks to all of you. I am sure that all who receive one will be very pleased.

As I was rolling them up and placing the tag and tying the bow, I was very impressed with the skill and imagination that went into creating them. I just hope you will keep up the good work so we can keep contributing as many next year. Thanks so much!

Guild Placemat Challenge

Have you picked your triadic colour scheme yet? If you have a couple of favorite choices, you might want to make more than one entry, although one person cannot win more than one prize. These placemats are the perfect opportunity to try a technique that may be new to you. **Rules to Play by:**

- 1. Triadic colour scheme.
- 2. Neutral background.
- 3. May be pieced or appliqued or both. (No embellishments that require careful handling since the quilts will be stacked for transport).
- 4. Landscape format.
- 5. Placemat size (12" by 18").
- 6. Due at either of the April guild meetings. *Please note the change in due date* According to our guild handbook, non-show year challenge entries are always due in April and will be voted on at the May general meeting.
- 7. No hanging sleeve required.
- 8. Pin a paper label to the back that includes your name, guild number, and whether or not you wish to donate the entry to the placemat committee or have it returned.

Guest Speaker: The Knife Sharpener, Ken Romanyshyn has a workshop at his home and sharpens knives, scissors and garden tools. Some of his wisdom:

- Price differences reflect the quality of the metal used
- Test drive the scissors you are thinking of buying (take fabric samples with you to the store)
- Look for one flat cutting side of blades and a bolt and nut fastening at the centre rather than rivets
- To keep your scissors clean, use a drop or spray of Isopropyl Alcohol or vinegar, then work the scissors to get debris out. Put a drop of mineral oil (washable) on top and bottom of bolt.
- To keep pinking sheers cutting smoothly, cut through 3 layers of waxed paper. Lots of other fascinating information; enjoyed by all.

Soft Amaretti Cookie Recipe

At our potluck holiday dinner, Arlene Ackerman brought these delicious gluten free cookies! Here is the recipe:

250 g almond flour (scant 2 1/2 cups) 200 g sugar (approx. 1 cup) zest of one medium lemon 3 egg whites (6 Tbsp, 120 g) (1 egg white= \sim 40 g) 1 tsp bitter almond extract

1/3 c granulated sugar set aside on plate for rolling

- 1. Preheat oven to 325°. Place rack in centre of oven.
- 2. Line large baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 3. In large bowl, whisk almond flour and sugar together.
- 4. Add grated lemon zest and whisk a few times more. Set aside.
- 5. In a separate bowl, whisk the egg whites to the soft peak stage. Whisk in the bitter alond extract.
- 6. Gently incorporate the egg whites into the dry ingredients until the mixture is completely moist. Use a small ice cream scoop or tablespoon to portion the dough.
- 7. With slightly damp hands, place your palms in the plate of sugar. Roll each ball of dough in the sugar

- on your palms and then in the sugar on the plate.
- 8. Place on the paper lined baking sheet.
- 9. Bake for about 25 minutes until the bottoms are golden brown in colour. They will not spread or run. Do not OVERBAKE!!
- 10. Cool before storing at room temperature in airtight containers. They will keep for 3-4 days.
