Placemats

There was a bit of a miscount of placemats turned in at the evening meeting in November, the count was actually a total of 29 placemats for the November meetings. There was 1 placemat turned in at the December meeting, giving us a grand total of 438 placemats and 37 tea cozies. Our Christmas giving was very generous. The Guild donated in December as follows:

Meals on Wheels Nanaimo 195 placemats * Meals on Wheels Gabriola Island 58 placemats * Meals on Wheels Ladysmith 17 placemats, 17 matching tea cozies * Salvation Army Christmas Hamper Program 130 placemats, 20 tea cozies. **Total: 400 placemats and 37 tea cozies.**

I am counting on your generosity. I will have more batting to hand out at the January meeting and you will have scraps left over from the quilts made for the show. Welcome back. Books signed out in November are due this month. Many of the date due slips in your books read January 21, 2025. They should read January 21, 2026.


We have begun weeding out some of our older titles. They were brought to the December meeting for members to take. The ones we still have will be on the "Free Table" in January.

Approximately one fat quarter of three assorted fabrics to be worked with plus your own additions. Quilt Show Boutique

The Boutique will be open for the 2026 Quilt Show to members who wish to sell their wares. In February we will have a table where you can pick up your vendor packages. These packages will have information about the boutique and how the "system" works for tagging your products. We will not be allowing items that are knitted, crocheted, or felted, fabric only, and please no scented items. Some ideas that were popular at our last show were microwave bowls, placemats, runners, first aid purses, bookmarks, aprons, oven towels, and a record number of quilts of all sizes. If you need inspiration or ideas try Pinterest. Look at those scraps and rethink how you can use them up outside of making a quilt. *Linda Macey*

The guild boutique sale is open to all guild members whose membership was paid by October 2025.

The boutique is looking for a wide variety of good quality items made from fabric. This excludes all knitted, felted or crocheted items.

Each member is invited to bring up to 100 items in total. Member's name and guild number must be on ALL totes and lids. If you have more than 100 items please contact the Boutique coordinator to discuss.

Items having identifying business labels, business cards, etc will be pulled from the sale.

Members putting items into the boutique are required to volunteer a shift in the boutique on each day of the show. Sign up sheets will be available for you to book your times.

Each member decides their own prices. The guild will be taking 10% off your total sales to cover boutique expenses and anything over this goes to benefit the guild, so take that into consideration when pricing your items.

Do not multi price your items, e.g. buy one at \$10.00 or buy two for \$15.00.

Props...bring whatever special props you want with your items. If you have a large prop, let us know before set up day to ensure we can accommodate it.

Members with fewer items can expect all items will be put out to start. Members with a larger number of items will not have all items put out to start. Boutique items will be replenished throughout the day by committee members as space becomes available.

Items are to be checked into the boutique on set up day (Thursday) between 8 and 11:30.

We will help with labelling corrections but do not have time to do corrections for you. This will take some time as together we inventory all items in your tote and check they match your inventory sheet and that the price tags are correct.

Items will be ready for pickup (Sunday) between 10 and 12:30 on first come first served basis. Again together we will inventory what items have not been sold and match this with your inventory sheet.

The Treasurer will issue cheques for sold items as soon as the quilt show accounts are completed.

Quilters' Chat continued

When I first began my quilting journey I found **TeresaDownUnder** on Facebook. Her short videos focussed on specific techniques; with pictures she took me through the steps of making a new block while clearly demonstrating the techniques. Each tutorial included examples of changes in the block using colour or placement to demonstrate the versatility of the block. She still posts most days. You can find her videos at **TeresaDownUnder** on YouTube and Facebook.

Sam from **Curious Handmade** is a new find for me. She focuses on "sewing made beautifully simple with inspo for all beginners and free resources". The first post I found was about some of her favourite sewing tools, some of which I have and a couple I really must get! Her projects are attractive, useful and look fun to make. Sam's Facebook page is growing rapidly and her webpage is being redesigned as I write this, so much more is coming. <https://linktr.ee/samcurioushandmade>

When I began quilting I wasn't going to build a stash, I would only buy what I needed for each project! I am now on my third bookcase of fabric, some is waiting for the possibilities and some is the extra fabric left over

due to careful planning or buying extra for the cutting "mistakes". The rest is the smaller bits sorted by colour, ready for sewing projects. This is all the result of trying to catch up on all the time I wasn't quilting by making as many quilts and other sewing projects and have given many to family, friends and as donations. As they leave the house I think "I will always remember that one because of the time and effort I put in" and then I don't because there are new materials and patterns to swirl around in my brain. But, I don't want to lose all those memories so I started looking for solutions. I found a digital recording program online to house my quilt photos and information. It was easy to learn and has helped me organize my records. It is fun to look back at what I have created. I have just begun the recording and these darker winter days are a great time to spend a little time each week getting the file updated. Do you keep a record of your quilts? Is it paper and pen, photos, digital or something else....? Let me know!
