

#### **Online Safety**

If you receive emails from the Nanaimo Quilters' Guild, make sure you verify that they are coming from a reputable source. If in doubt, do not open the email and delete it immediately. Below is Pat Clements' story about what happened when she received an email which appeared to be from another Guild member.

Fellow guild members, this is my story of getting duped by some clever con artists.

On Saturday December 5, I received an email from a guild member who I know well and in the subject line was Nanaimo Quilters Guild. The email stated "Hi Pat I need your assistance, are you accessible? I'm out of town, I need you to handle this on behalf for "NQG". We need some gift vouchers for gifts to assist Veterans at hospice care with preventative items due to Covid-19. Happy Holidays. It was signed Regards, Sincerely yours, ZZ (I have used initials although it was signed by the guild member and her position) It also included a phone number which I learned wasn't the member's (770 737-1031). I have typed the email exactly as it was sent.

My response: Hello ZZ Yes I am accessible and willing to help out. I am not sure what to do. Pat

Reply: I'm glad you'll like to assist Pat, Our general surroundings appears to have gone insane. Our lifestyle has changed for the time being. This came as a personal thought after a brief meeting with a Vet yesterday at one of the Hospices I visited. I'll work out explicit subtleties. Please purchase of 5 (five) gift cards of \$100.00 each for the sum of \$500.00 of any Prepaid Visa/Vanilla or Master gift cards. You can get vouchers from convenient stores or online, to reveal code please make photo of both sides of card and email to Hospice admin via (veteranscareunit@usa.com). Please note: donated by "NQG" Would you be able to deal with this for me today? I will be liable for the refund and will a check be fine? I will be thankful on the off chance that you can. Regards Sincerely yours, ZZetc

There were a couple of more emails but I wanted to include the following,

Hello ZZ I am writing this after mulling over your request. I am willing to assist but have a few questions. Who do I submit my bill to? What do I do with the gift cards once I have purchased them? I may need some assistance with taking the pictures

as I don't have a smart phone but I can get some assistance with this. My last question is the guild okay with this or are you paying for the gift cards? I look forward to hearing from you. Pat Clements

ZZ reply: Hi Pat I'm responsible for the reimbursement, all expense made will be refunded by me because this came as a personal request but I wanted to do this as good course and on behalf of "NQG", so the bill is on me. Please can you keep the gift cards and hand them over when I see us. I'll be needing them for reference purpose. So just to reiterate that I will be 100 percent responsible for refund. I thank you for all that you do. Hope the holidays brings us closer to our wishes for the year end. (same signature)

A few more emails occured as I expressed concerns, discomfort and misgivings. I even said to my sister I am not going to do it. However feeling guilty I purchased the gift cards on December 7 and mailed the photos of the gift cards on Dec. 8. I received thank yous from Veterans Care and ZZ. Are you shaking your head? I have many times since this all happened. Then came a request for 4 more \$100 gift cards "they hadn't anticipated the need" My response was "sorry to disappoint but I am unable to do so". You owe me \$531.24 Correspondence ceased.

I have learned several valuable lessons. Check the email address. If you are uncomfortable or have misgivings check them out - phone the person in question. Look at the grammer, spelling and words used. Don't feel bad if you have to say no. When looking back on the correspondence over 6 days I see all the red flags I didn't heed.

I would like to apologize to ZZ that I would think I was even corresponding with her. Also to the guild my sincere apologies.

This incident has been reported to the RCMP. My bank account or credit cards have not been compromised I hope by telling my story no one else will get caught up in such a scam.

Well everyone, it's that time again. Time to think of what the guild needs from us and decide what we can each do to help.


