Quilts of Valour

A Quilt of Valour(™) is a hug from a grateful nation and a tribute to an injured Canadian Armed Forces member, past or present.

If you are making a quilt or have a quilt to donate please ensure it meets QOV specifications. I have wide dark and light wide backing available for your quilts as well as wide batting.

The organization has quilt specifics including:

- fabrics should be new and 100% cotton
- patterns and blocks can be of any design; however, recipients often prefer a Canadian theme
- quilts must be completed with a top, batting and backing- either machine or hand quilted. A tied or tufted quilt are not accepted.
- quilts must be large enough to cover an average-sized adult, minimum size 55' X70' and maximum size 72' X 84'
- batting should be 100% cotton or 80/20 cotton/poly blend. Wool, bamboo or 100% polyester batting should be avoided.

Please free to contact me if you have any questions or would like some supplies.

Block of the Month Sew-Along

Hi all, it will be nice to see everyone at the March 16 meeting. I'm looking forward to doing the block draw in March. To remind you: each block you turn in gets a ticket to win all the blocks turned in.

The March block comes from the Quilter's Cache www.quilterschache. com/G/GramsOldQuiltBlock.html It's a 9" block which uses templates but is pretty straightforward. I really like that the templates have the colours listed on them which are white for the background and green fabric in honour of St. Patrick's Day.

Also if you intend on making multiple blocks you can make templates using clear plastic lids (e.g. large salads), and if you use a glue stick you can make it even easier to cut out by taping the shape to the plastic. I look forward to seeing the resulting blocks.
