Most importantly please write a short message regarding where you got the quilt, who made it if you know (family) what you paid for it or any other facts you want to share. Motion: Moved by Lorna Craig and seconded by Bonnie Dormuth to accept Minutes of January 21, 2026 General meeting as published in the newsletter. Carried.

Correspondence: Thank you cards from Nanaimo Renal Dialysis Program and Claire Bredesen for our donation of quilts.

Treasurer's Report: posted on bulletin board

Program: Darcy Hunter from Fredericton, New Brunswick presented an interesting Zoom trunk show of her large and small collage pieces inspired by the natural wonders of her home province.

Quilt Show Volunteers: Ellen Ellis encouraged members to sign up for as many jobs as possible for the quilt show. Shifts are 2 hours. Family and friends are invited to help.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Quilt Bee: Joan Irving reported that 30 members took part in the annual Quilt Bee at Oliver Woods. 16 quilts were completed that day and 17 more were handed in today. No batting will be available until the fall. Tote bags are still needed.

Program: Carolyn Hunter encouraged members to sign up for Darcy Hunter's Mini Flower Collage Zoom class on March 4. UFO Day will be held on March 28 at Oliver Woods for a cost of \$12, starting at 9 am. A Make and Take Workshop will be held on April. 25. It will feature 4 mini classes. Cost will be \$25

Donations: Bonnie Eaton reminded members that no one from the Donation Committee would be at the next three evening meetings, however if anyone needs batting or backing, they should email Bonnie and she would arrange for the supplies to be made available.

Retreat: Vicki Zoltay reported that one more person was needed for the Retreat to be held Oct. 13-16 on Quadra Island.

Membership: Barb Kerfoot asked members to please pick up their membership cards. Challenge: Barb Kerfoot announced that 3 Challenge kits had been handed in and were available to members.

Quilt Show: Janet Knecht reported that raffle ticket sales were in full swing and that members should bring in their ticket stubs in a timely manner to avoid losses. She and Kathleen Kane clarified that Traditional Small quilts included wallhangings. Original small quilts would

be under the category of Art Quilts. Several Depot Captains are still needed. The instructions for making sleeves are on the website. Possibly a demo on making sleeves will be held at the March meeting. Janet encouraged members to volunteer for several jobs at the show.

Boutique: Moire Porter announced that the boutique packages are available. Members can put in up to 100 items for sale. All items must be individually priced. Suggested pricing is included in the package, although pricing is up to the maker. The guild receives 10 % of the price for sold items. No business cards are allowed. The maker's name must be on the tote and lid. Drop off of items is Thursday between 8 and 9 am and pick up will be on Sunday from 9-11:30 am.
