We have much to learn from someone who doesn't hold back in her approach to applique. You are an inspiration to us, Val.

### WORKSHOP: Designing a Landscape Quilt

Sign up soon! Space will be open to non guild members in August

October 19 and November 2, 2019

FEE: \$95 payable to the Guild

\$6 material fee payable to instructor

**Description:** Create a small quilted seascape while learning fabric selection and Carol's special pieced applique construction method. This class will start with discussions on how Carol creates patterns. Then while using either one of her designs (four to pick from) or drafting your own design begin fabric selection with tips for creating visual depth in your water, sky and islands. During this step, pieced applique construction technique will be demonstrated, using both the hand and machine methods. Then taking this seascape, we will give it an authentic look while exploring the basic surface embellishment techniques I use in my landscape quilts. Learn the processes for creating textured objects, such as bushes and trees from far away to up close and personal. Create water movement and shading as well as a passing sail boat using thread painting and machine embroidery.

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## April Block of the Month: 1939 Vintage Butterfly

Thanks to everyone who made a Strawberry block. It's always a joy to see the fabrics you use in the blocks. Pat Montgomery won the 12 afternoon blocks. Pat said that her husband had seen and liked the block she made. He hoped she would win the blocks and she DID. Funny how that works sometimes. Sandy Blakely won 7 blocks at the evening meeting.

Now I know I'm taking a chance, but I'm challenging you to make the 1939 Vintage Butterfly block on McCall's Quilting website: <https://s23928.pcdn.co/wp-content/uploads/2017/10/Butterfly-Pattern.pdf>

Fabrics needed: background: white or white-on white, head, body & wings: assorted spring colours. Templates are available on the above website, or contact Sarah. The block is 9" unfinished. Just remember to not resize the pages if you print the templates. Be sure to mark the fabric so you can line up the pieces properly (back stitch from the dots except if it's an outside seam in which case complete the seam). Lay out the pieces and take your time.

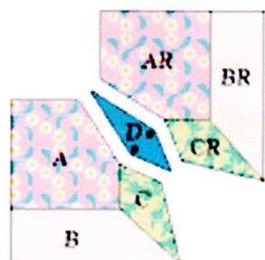
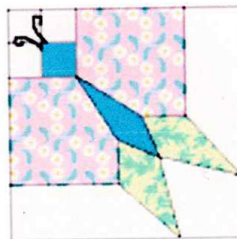
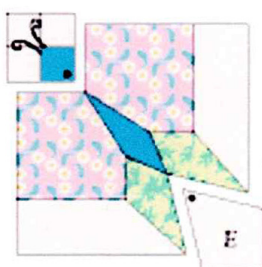

Piecing the Block: Step 1: To make butterfly head, referring to Diagram I, stitch together 2 background 1 3/4" squares and 1 colour 1 3/4" square. Work stem stitch (Diagram II) with black embroidery floss to create antennae.

Step 2: Stitch together matching Template A/AR fabrics, matching Template C/CR fabrics and background Template B/BR fabrics to create wing/tail units (Diagram III). Using set-in seams, sew wing/tail units to Template D fabric. Set-in matching head unit and background Template E fabric to complete the Butterfly block. ### Log Cabin Block (10 1/2" unfinished)

Fabric Requirements:

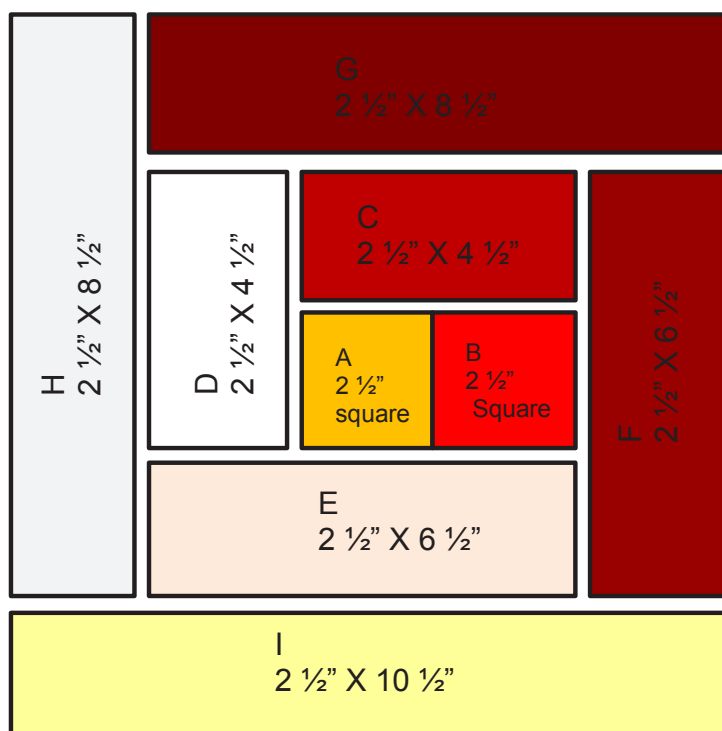
2 1/2" wide strips of various darks (reds)

2 1/2" wide strips of lights (white - cream)

2 1/2" squares of yellow for centres

8 rows of 6 blocks will give you a quilt approximately 60" x 80".

No borders needed, just layer, quilt and bind.

### Rules to Play By

- The guild boutique sale is open to all guild members whose membership was paid by September, 2018.
- The boutique is looking for a wide variety of good quality items made from fabric. For example, no knit or crochet items.
- Each member is invited to bring up to 100 items.
- Items having identifying business labels, business cards, etc., will be pulled from the sale.
- Members putting items into the boutique are required to volunteer a shift a day in the boutique. Sign up sheets are available.
- Volunteers are asked to put cell phones on vibrate for the duration of your shift.
- Each member decides their own prices. 10% will be added by the guild to cover boutique expenses so take that into consideration when pricing.
- Member's name and guild number must be on all totes/ lids.
- Props...bring whatever special props you want with your items. If you have large prop, let us know before set up day.
- Members with fewer items can expect all items will be put out to start. Members with a larger number of items will not have all items put out to start. Boutique items will be replenished throughout the day by committee members.
- Items are to be checked into the boutique on set up day (Thursday) between 8 and 10.
- We will help with labelling corrections, but do not have time to do corrections for you.
- Treasurer will issue cheques for sold items as soon as the quilt show accounts are completed.
- A boutique committee member will be available to answer questions at all guild meetings.
