## **Donation Quilts**

We took in 16 quilts on March 16. Lynn took 62 baby hats to NRGH. We have bought a stamp for making new donation labels (photo at right). We will be giving 8 more quilts to Samaritan House, bringing our total to 24.

Through the Nanaimo Hospital Foundation, we received a request from a local pediatrician and GP, who are starting "Roots to Read" NRGH Newborn Literacy Project. This will provide every newborn with 2 new books, information about early literacy, library access and resources. They need fabric (baby friendly!) book bags approx. 11" wide by 11-12" tall (serge or zig-zag the seams, turn under at the top and finish with a couple of rows of stitching. Make fabric handles or use purchased webbing (2, 15" strips about 1" wide). We will accept them at our monthly meetings. See photos on page 9.

#### Nanaimo Quilters' Guild 2022 Challenge

Since we have all been housebound for so long, we decided that an appropriate theme for the next challenge should be Houses. We ask you to choose to do a small quilt that speaks to you of your idea of house and home. The quilts will be displayed for voting at the 2022 Christmas meeting.

Here are the Rules to Play by:

- A quilt must have 3 layers: top, batting and backing.
- No kit or registration is required.
- Please don't use a commercial pattern. We want to see your ideas!
- Perhaps you could start with a basic Schoolhouse block and go to town on it.
- You could choose to represent one room or a whole house. Let your imagination run free!
- Embellish as much as you want. Maybe you'll want to choose a holiday theme.
- Finished perimeter to be less than 100". For example: a circle smaller than  $31\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter, a square smaller than 25" x 25" or a rectangle less than 20" x 30" would qualify.
- Colour palette and fabrics of your choosing.
- Submit quilt in an opaque bag with your name pinned to the back of the quilt and written on the bag. Please include your telephone number.

• Challenge quilt is due by the November meeting. This will allow us time to plan the hanging. We know that life happens, so some extension may be granted for reasonable grounds.

• There will be no prizes again this year, only ribbons.

## **CQA Report**

Plans are moving ahead with a day trip to the Canadian Quilters' Association's annual Quilt Canada show, to be held in Vancouver this year.

We have 31 people interested in travelling by bus and can take up to 56. If you are interested in seeing this national juried quilt show in an easy and stress-free way, please consider coming with us.

Our travel date is Thursday, June 16. We will be picked up in Nanaimo, taken via Departure Bay ferry to Vancouver and then dropped off right at the door of the Convention Centre. Later that afternoon we will be picked up again for the return trip home.

We'll choose a pick up place in Nanaimo that is easy for drop off or has room to leave your car for the day if you choose.

Our final cost per person will probably be between \$85 and \$120, depending on how many people travel with us. This will include our show entry tickets which I will purchase for us, but does not include personal ferry fares. Seniors will travel by ferry for free (65 and over) while those under 65 will have to pay the usual fare. You will need government ID for proof of age if you are a senior.

We did this trip last time the show was in Vancouver and it was a full day. Most of us were glad to have the bus take care of our trip back home so we could relax and have a pleasant and easy return to Nanaimo. For newer members this can be another great way to get to know some of your fellow guild members. And for those with friends in the Parksville guild, they are planning a trip over on the same day, so it should be a fun filled day all around!

Seats are open to our guild members until the April meeting date, after that we will invite any Parksville or Modern guild members who want to join us, and by May 1st we will open any remaining seats to family and friends.

A more detailed itinerary will come out to all travellers as we get closer to the date. For now we have booked the bus and are taking names of those interested. You can contact me by email anytime to have your name added to the list. I hope we'll have a full or nearly full bus for the trip. The more the merrier and we hope this will be a most merry day!
