Guild Placemat Challenge

Have you made a placemat yet? Still unsure of what to make? How about 9 patches? Use 2 and 1/2 inch strips or cut charm squares into 4 pieces. Use one of the colours in the centre, another colour for the corners and the last colour for the sides. Make it scrappy or limit yourself to just 3 fabrics, as long as it is a triadic colour scheme (reds, yellow, blues or greens, purples, and oranges, etc.). 6 nine patch blocks would create a 12 by 18 inch placemat. Mix it up a little and throw in a neutral here and there. How about a log cabin block with one colour for the centre, scrappy strips of another colour for two sides and scrappy strips of the third colour for the other two sides...or courthouse steps...or churn dash blocks...or 9 patches with half square triangles in the corners. If you like art quilts, blues, reds, and yellows make a nice sunset over water. Greys and blacks can act as silhouettes of landforms. Have fun. Placemats are due at either the day or evening meeting in April. They will be displayed at the AGM in May, when voting by attending members will take place.

Rules to Play by:

- 1. Triadic colour scheme.
- 2. Neutral background.
- 3. May be pieced or appliqued. (no delicate embellishments).
- 4. Landscape format (horizontal).
- 5. Placemat size (12" by 18").
- 6. Due at April meetings.
- 7. No hanging sleeve.

8. Paper label pinned to back with name, guild number, and donate or return to maker.

Donation Quilts

In March we received 2 baby quilts, 4 NICU quits, and 19 lap quilts for a total of 25 quilts. We also received 6 tote bags for Crossroads. A new member donated 10 quilts, and has 40 still to donate. We have given 8 lap quilts to Sunfield Manor seniors supportive housing.

Our storage locker is bursting! We need to move out backing fabric to make room for quilts and batting. At our April meeting, we will be holding a "Backing Bonanza!" of all of our backing fabric. As usual, you are welcome to sign out any backing and use it for your future donation quilts. If you see some that you would like to use in your own personal quilts, you will be able to purchase it (at a price of \$5 per meter). We will use any funds raised from this sale to put towards purchasing more batting.

We received a thankyou letter from the Nanaimo & District Hospital Foundation for our quilts for patients in the NICU, Renal, Palliative, VI Scans, and Cancer units.

In 2023, 264 newborns spent at least one night in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). They all received a handmade quilt during their stay and then took it home. The NICU is running very low on incubator quilts: 36" x 48" (or close), which allows for the overhang. Batting is not necessary, nor is intricate stitching. Dark flannelette backing is preferred to block out the light.

Another option for our sewers is Mama Hearts – small sewn hearts that are approx. $3^{\circ} \times 3^{\circ}$ for Moms of babies in the NICU to cuddle and rub to get their scent on the heart, and then place the heart near their baby in the incubator. (washable fabric and stuffing required)

Lastly, we have a new knitting pattern for preemie baby beanies, preferred by the NICU, courtesy of the Hospital Auxiliary and Bonnie Dimitry. See page 6 for directions.

Simple Preemie Beanie

Materials: Yarn – any 4 ply Baby yarn or something similar to give you the approx. gauge – the yarn should be 100% acrylic or a synthetic blend (must be machine washable) and very soft.

Set of 5 double-pointed Size 3 (3.25 mm) needles,

Stitch marker,

Tapestry needle

Gauge: 28 sts X 36 rows = 10 cm or 4° – this is not very important but is just something to aim for. The final size may vary but so do baby's heads.

Loosely cast on 64 sts (16 sts/needle). This can be increased or decreased in units of 4 sts, depending on the weight of yarn and size of needle), place stitch marker if using, and join in a round being careful not to twist the stitches.

Knit 2 sts, Purl 2 sts* (repeat) for this and every round until the piece measures between 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " to 6" long.

To shape the crown:

1st round - k2tog, purl 2* (repeat),

2nd round - K1, purl 2* (repeat),

3rd round - K1, P2tog* (repeat),

4th round – K1, P1* (repeat),

5th round – K2tog* (repeat),

6th round - K2tog* (repeat),

Finishing:

Cut yarn leaving a 6" tail. With tapestry needle thread through the remaining sts twice, pull snugly and secure. Weave in all loose ends.

Fold up approx. 1" to form a cuff and you are finished. No need to wash these as they are laundered in the hospital before they are used.






