

Template Layout sheets were designed and provided with these instruction to speed up the cutting process, allowing you to stack and cut your fat quarters in two groups of nine fabrics. An even amount of yardage is needed for each colour. This small wall hanging is definitely one to add to your

Did You Know ...? Donated Fabrics / Quilts & more

At the February meeting we learned of the passing of one of our members, Yvonne Jans. Yvonne had been a member of the Guild since 1997, and had been active on several committees over the years. Yvonne's family donated several unfinished quilts and fabrics to the Guild in hopes they could be finished or made into quilts and given out to those in need in our Community through our Donation Quilts Committee.

This is not the first time the Guild has received large donations of fabrics and unfinished projects from members or from the families of those who have passed on. The following is just a small sampling of a few of these donations.

During the mid-1990's, one of our past members, Virginia Brucker, donated several "kits" that she had made up of baby quilt panels complete with batting and backing from her stash. These were handed out to members to make baby quilts that were donated to the Pediatrics Ward at the Nanaimo Regional General Hospital. In 2003, Virginia, with the help of her satellite group, the Passionate Purples, assembled 100 kits to make Christmas stockings for those who had lost their homes in the forest fires in the British Columbia Interior during the summer. The kits contained enough fabric and supplies to make one stocking, and additional fabrics, trimmings and patterns were available to those who wanted to make more. This resulted in 209 Christmas stockings being made.

In 2008, one of our Founding members, Arlene Warwick (1984, 2004-2008) made a donation of 17 finished quilts. Arlene was very ill and had requested her quilts be donated by the Guild to comfort those in need. A few weeks later, Arlene passed away and it was decided to donate the quilts under Arlene's name bearing a special label to the Hospice group as she had spent time volunteering with them.

The first of these was Shelly Fraser who had joined the Guild in 1985. Many members made and finished several quilts with her fabrics, and at the Quilt Show in June, a display of these quilts along with photos of Shelly was on display. Also, at the Quilt Show the Demonstration Committee used Shelly's fabric to make quilts during the show. The other member who passed along her quilting fabrics was one of our Honorary Founding members, Fran Halsall (1984-2010). Many quilts and items for donation were made.

Sometimes fabric and quilts come to the Guild in an indirect manner, such as the fabrics of one of our past members, Sherry-Lynne Ellis (2007-2011). After leaving the Guild Sherry-Lynne gave her quilting supplies and fabrics to one of our Guild members, who turned around and shared these fabrics with other members and some of our satellite groups for making donation quilts. This member always makes sure we know what quilts and items were made from Sherry-Lynne's fabrics.

As stated earlier, this is just a small sampling of the types of donations that the Donation Committee receives, and yes, many members donate fabrics on a continuous basis which is always greatly received. If you think you might want to donate fabrics or quilt tops, please contact the Donations Committee for more information or to make arrangement with them. Remember, this all goes to a good cause.
