I have received new batting but have not cut it up yet. Will do over the summer.


Thank you to all the regulars, it's great to catch up. I wonder if anyone is interested in bringing a coffee and chair in June just for a year end chat?



Library

Our guild library is still unavailable for our use; however, virtual borrowing of popular quilting magazines and books from our regional library is possible. Thanks to Barb Kerfoot for researching and submitting the information below.

Quilting Magazines Online at your Local Library

The Vancouver Island Regional Library has many quilting magazines that you can find online at your leisure. You only need a library card but that is free and easy to get.

You can borrow titles such as:

McCall's Quilting Quilters Companion
Fons and Porter's Love of Quilting Quilts for Today
Quilting Arts Magazine Great Australian Quilts
Love Patchworks & Quilting Weekend Quilting
Quiltmaker Quilts form Precut Fabric
Today's Quilter Fat Quarter Collection

The steps below were taken when using a PC laptop. For other devices, take a look at **Get Help** and then **Technology** headings on the library website for how to videos for downloading a special app called Libby which you will need.

- 1. Go to the library website at www.virl.bc.ca
- 2. Look for the heading Read, Watch, Listen
- 3. Select Magazines and Newspapers
- 4. Scroll through the list until you see OverDrive
- 5. You will probably need to launch the **Libby app** and answer some questions. It will tell you what to do if you do not yet have a library card.



This is Libby!

6. If you already have a card, enter your number and PIN and you will be on.



- 7. Find the Magazine list. You can **refine the search to subject Crafts** and look through over a hundred magazines to find ones of interest. Watch out you might get sidetracked with other craft titles!
- 8. Select any title you want and you can **read a sample or even borrow the whole issue**. Many have several issues with the current listed first. Scroll down for others that might be available.
- 9. Tap the page on the left or right to move back and forward through the issue.

In most cases you can have the magazine for **21 days** before it disappears and there are **no limits** on how many you can borrow.

Confused? Need help? Call your local library for assistance.

Enjoy reading in these covid times from the comfort of your favourite chair when the Guild library is not available to you.

You will also see that the library has many other online resources such as movies, music, audiobooks and ebooks to entertain you in your free time.





Block of the Month Sew-Along



Hi all, I can't believe that we are almost done with April. It's been a busy month for me as I have decreased my hours at Quality Foods so I can work on more customer quilts. It was a good move but it made me decide to do a nice simple, quick block for this month.

It's a wonderful 12 1/2" unfinished block called Whirlwind and I hope you like it too. The link is: https://www.sewcanshe.com/blog/2016/4/29/classic-blocks-fresh-fabric-the-whirlwind-quilt-block by Caroline Fairbanks-Critchfield. She has a wonderful step by step post and her web site is well worth checking out. To preview: the block uses 2--WOF strips (a focus and a background). I used Easter eggs for April but as always choose fabrics that you like.

If you like, send me pictures of this and past blocks so I can make a slideshow to show at the next guild meeting. I know everyone would love to see how you are getting along. Plus if you would like to talk about your block in the meeting you're are more than welcome to. If you haven't been to a zoom guild meeting I hope you will next time as it is wonderful to see everyone and catch up on what they are up to. Plus you get a peak into their homes. Lol.

FABRIC BASKET

submitted by Christine Hustins Copyright by Shabby Fabrics

Please note:all seams are 1/2" WOF= Width of fabric Finishes to approx. 10" x 9" x 7"

REQUIRED MATERIALS

- •1 Magic Pillowcase Kit, Standard Size
- •1/2 yard fusible fleece (44 -45" wide)
- •1 yard fusible interfacing (20" wide)

RECOMMENDED PRODUCTS

- •Creative Grids 4 1/2" square ruler
- •Olfa 45 mm Rortary Cutter
- Clover Point 2 Point Turner
- Clover Wonder Clips
- Clover Flower Head Pins

(all available at ShabbyFabrics.com)

CUT FABRICS


From **main body** fabric, cut:

- •(1) 18" x WOF strip for outer Basket
- •(1) 8" x WOF for **lining**

From cuff fabric, cut:

- •(1) 9" x WOF for lining
- From **accent** fabric, cut:
- •(1) 3" x WOF for lining

OUTER BASKET




Cut 4 1/2" squares from bottom corners.(IMPORTANT: If you are using directional fabric, note orientation is right side up before cutting.)

Align squares, right sides together, and sew along sides and bottom with a 1/2" seam allowance, leaving notched corners open. Press seams open.







Fabric Baskets Page 2


BOXED CORNERS

Fold fabric so the two raw edges of a notched corner are in a straight line, matching the side seam with the bottom seam. Sew along raw edge with a 1/2" seam allowance.

Repeat for the corner on the other side.

This is your Outer Basket.

Do not turn right side out. Set aside for a laterr step.



LINING

Join 3" strip, 9" strip, and 8" strip as shown (right) using a 1/2" seam allowance. (IMPORTANT: If you are using directional fabric, note orientation before sewing. The 3" strip will be folded to the outside of the basket, so it should be oriented "upside down" in this arrangement.) Press seams open.

From this, cut (2) 18" x 18" squares.


From fusible interfacing, cut (2) 18" x 18" squares.


Fuse fusible interfacing to wrong side of each pieced lining square. Because fusible interfacing can be sensitive to heat, we recommend ironing from the fabric side or using a pressing cloth.

Cut 4 1/2 ' squares from bottom corners.

Align squares, right sides together, and sew along sides and bottom with a 1/2" seam allowance, leaving notched corners open. Press seams open.

Refer to Boxed Corners instructions above to box both corners. This is your lining. Turn right side out.





ASSEMBLE BASKET

Place Lining (right side out) inside Outer Basket (inside out), aligning raw edges and matching Side Seams. Sew around edge with a 1/2" seam allowance, leaving a 6" opening for turning.

Turn through opening. Use point turner to push out seams fully. Fold opening inward 1/2" and press. Use Wonder Clips around entire perimeter to secure opening and prevent seams from rolling inward. Top stitch 1/3" - 1/4" around entire perimeter.

Fold top edge down and out about 3" to create a cuff.
