The time is coming! Please hand in your creation at the May 20 meeting (doors open at 6:00 pm). Don't forget to include a sleeve so that it can be pinned up for all to vote on. This does not need to be as large as the regular show items but we do need something to pin into. Also remember to put a paper label on the back with the **title, your name and phone number**.

Quilt Show Boutique

The following is a reminder of what you need to do before you bring your tote(s) to the Boutique (upstairs in pool table area) on the morning Thursday May 28th between 8:00 and 9:30. Processing will be on a first come, first serve basis.

1. Please put your name and guild membership number clearly on the lids (lids should have this info on the top and bottoms) and on the side of your totes. We will then start the process of checking your items in. You must stay with your tote(s) during this process.
2. It will go much quicker if your items are in the same order as they appear on your inventory sheets as our volunteers will be cross checking between the tag and inventory sheet that all items are accounted for. Once they are accounted for you will sign your inventory sheets and you are then you are free to go.
3. If you are bringing props please put your name and guild membership number on the props so that they can be returned to you. If directions are needed please write them on a sheet of paper and leave in your tote.

4. Each item you are selling **MUST** have a tag that comes in two parts with a perforation down the centre and attached to your item in the top left corner using a safety pin. (This consistency helps our customers find the sales tags easily.) Each side of the tag must contain the same information as the inventory sheet. Once your item is sold one part of the tag stays pinned to the sold item and the other is what we use to show proof of sale on your inventory sheet.

5. Both the line on the inventory sheets and tagged item must have the same information and dollar amount. This will be checked when your tote is inventoried and if there are errors it is up to you to correct. Our volunteers may help if they have the time.

5. It is vitally important that your inventory sheets and tags match. It is also vitally important that your tags are securely attached (safety pins work best) as we cannot sell an item if it doesn't have a tag attached. Please do not attach with straight pins.

6. If you are selling a set of something (ie placemats) please attach all items together using thread or knitting yarn and ensure that it is recorded as "set of 4" on the inventory sheet and tag so there is no confusion as to the number of items being sold.

7. On Sunday, May 31 between 9:00 and 11:30 we will take vendors on a first come, first serve basis to start the reverse process of checking your inventory. We will go through your unsold items and cross check the tag to the inventory sheet to ensure that all unsold items are being returned to you. Once they are accounted for you will sign your inventory sheets again and you are then free to go. This process will take longer as the items will not be in order so please be patient with our volunteers.

8. When volunteering in the Boutique please ensure your phone is off or on vibrate and that you recognize that you are there to work not to socialize. Our customer's service should come first.

Our volunteers will be in attendance the entire time the Boutique is open to act as security against shoplifting and to assist customers with their purchases and will endeavour to do this job well. If an item is stolen it will be discovered when we do the final inventory on Sunday. The Guild/Boutique will not be held responsible for theft.

The Guild Treasurer will be issuing cheques once all the paper work has been tallied and submitted to her.

Quilt Show Raffle Tickets

All Raffle tickets (stubs and money) need to be submitted to me at the May 20 meeting or by 12 noon Saturday May 30 at the Quilt show. Return the ticket stubs in an envelope or baggie (and the money if you did not pre-pay) to the raffle table.

All guild members are expected to sell tickets. Tickets are \$ 2 each, with 10 tickets per book (\$20 per book). Please count your tickets to make sure there are 10 in the booklet. Please print names and contact info clearly.

Tickets are only good to sell to BC addresses and phone numbers. You can sell to folks in other provinces or countries but the stub must have your address and phone number on it.

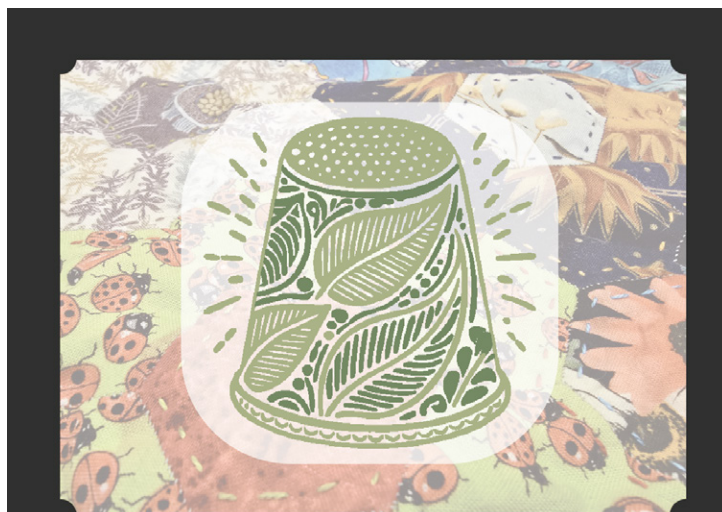

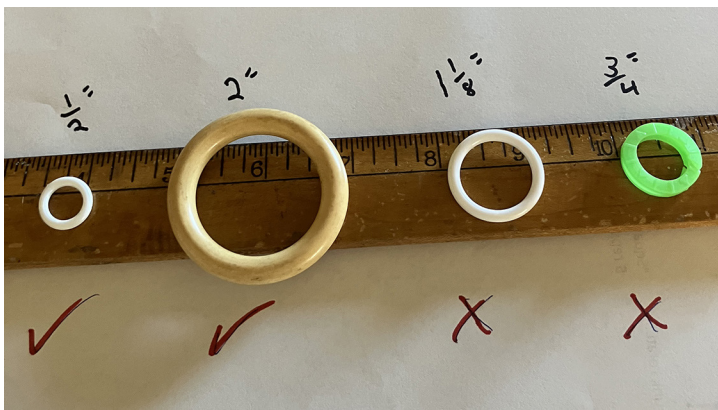

Fidget Quilts

In March I collected 12 fidget quilts, and in April 5 fidget quilts. It has come to my attention that we need to be careful about using small plastic rings in the quilts. Occasionally a patient has managed to get their finger stuck in a ring. I tried to do a size scale below to help with the sizing.

Two more ideas for adding textures to the quilts. I am thinking a child's fabric lei was sewn on this quilt. I love that the button does not need to be sewn on this quilt. I will be looking for buttons with large holes since I dislike sewing buttons! Thanks for the idea.
