Some jobs may be able to wait, but the Board of Directors needs to be in place at this meeting. Vicki began working on nominations in January, so it can't be said that anything was left to the last minute. We did the best job of this that we could and thankfully, Elaine Cadell and Ethyle Riawetz have stepped in to take over the job as co-Presidents and the guild goes on for another year.

Now if, upon reading this and understanding how things work, you have suggestions as to how we can improve the process, then do please let any of the directors know and we will discuss it at an executive meeting.

So, what words can I leave you with in my last President's Pen? I think I would say let's just relax and enjoy a pleasant summer. October 19 Quilting Inspired by Nature Dara Tomasson

Fee: \$40. An interactive and hands on workshop. Participants will learn 10 new quilting designs. Students translate the beauty of nature into free motion excellence through design challenges; exploring the art of combining designs to make them their own.



November 2 & November 16 Designing a Landscape Quilt

Carol Seeley Fee: \$95 payable to the Guild, \$6 material fee payable to Carol. Sign up soon! Space will be open to non guild members in August. Award winning instructor! www.fibreartnetwork.com Create a small quilted seascape while learning fabric selection and Carol's special pieced appliqué construction method.



Use either one of her four designs or draft your own design, then select fabric, with tips for creating visual depth in your water, sky and islands. Hand and machine pieced appliqué construction technique will be demonstrated. Explore basic surface embellishment techniques and learn how to create textured objects. Create water movement and shading using thread painting and machine embroidery.

December 2 UFO Day Fee: \$10 Finish some of those good projects while you enjoy the company of fellow quilters.

February 22 Scrappy Quilts Sandra Radley Fee: \$40

Wondering what to do with all those scraps? This workshop is the solution. Learn cutting techniques and tricks of the trade to turn your scraps into unique quilts that suit your style.



March 20 Trunk Show Stacy Day Fee: \$10 plus an appetizer Enjoy a social evening with fellow quilters as Stacy Day shares her work as a modern quilter. This promises to be a fun evening. March 21 Creating a Modern Quilt Stacy Day

Fee: \$40 Learn about the design and construction of a modern quilt while creating a fun, updated version of a classic dahlia quilt. Perfect for fussy cutting and showcasing your favourite fabrics.



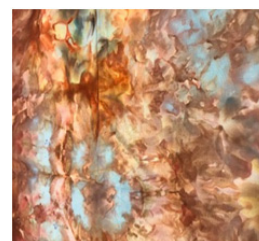
April 28 & May 2 Picture to Wall Hanging Kathy Bush

Fee: \$80 This class demonstrates a technique of taking a photograph or painting of your choice and creating a one-of-a-kind machine appliqué, quilted wall-hanging. The process involves using the picture or painting (participants are responsible for obtaining copyright permission from original artist) to create a pattern, enlarge it to a desired size, mark it for construction purposes, and use paper backed fusible and fabrics of your choice to complete your design. This class is for the experienced quilter with an expectation that you already know how to use fusible web and how to finish and enhance a machine appliqué project once it is fused to the background. It is basically a design and construction class that will require completion afterwards at home. Sewing machines will likely not be required. Photographs or painting choices are to be approved by the instructor prior to the class to ensure suitability.



June 1 Ice Dying Fabric Joy Hegland

Fee: \$95 Experience the magic of creating your own unique fabric. Ice dying is fascinating and fun. You are never really sure what your creation will look like but the results are fantastic. Fee includes 5 meters of fabric and all dying supplies.

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Voting at the Quilt Show

Shortly we will reconvene at the 2019 Material Magic Quilt Show to see the beautiful work done by our members. Here is a final reminder about your ballots. The Viewers Choice is a simplified white ballot with two choices each of three categories: your favourite bed quilt (white tag), wall quilt (blue tag) and other item (orange tag). There are 6 choices on the lime green Secret Categories ballot. Member ballots and public ballots are tallied up and that entry which receives the most votes overall is the Best of Show and the recipient of the CQA, Canadian Quilters Association Ribbon.

All Volunteer members will proceed to the Volunteer area to pick up their lanyards. In the lanyard will be your Viewers Choice ballot and your Secret Categories ballot. The 38 Show Committee members will also find in their lanyard their Show Committee ballot.

Non-Volunteer members receive their Viewers Choice ballot when they come through Admissions. Those members sign for their Secret Categories ballot at the Information Desk.

The Past Presidents pick up their information package with their lanyards and P.P. Awards ballot, the list of eligible quilts and their locations at the Information table. They may also request a Viewers Choice and Secret Categories ballot at that time. *Judith McLaughlin, Chair Ballot Committee and Past Presidents' Awards Committee*

Thank you to all the committee leads for working so diligently to make this quilt show a great one!!!

Boutique: To try and accommodate those who are volunteering at the show, Kathy Calder and her team will open at 9 am for you to do some shopping ahead of the crowds. You can also come before or after your shift to browse and shop.

Will be implementing the use of the "square" for the show for payments by charge cards.

Call to Entry: Val Ansell reports that she has 348 entries so we are going to have a fantastic show of quilts. Thank you to you all for contributing!!!

Merchant Mall: We now have 15 merchants participating in the MM. There is quite the variety so everyone should be pleased with the browsing and purchasing.

Publicity: Vicki Zoltay and myself attended the Shaw TV Program "Shaw Spotlight". The Program is called The Show on Shaw. We were one of 10 presenters - each group got only 5 minutes to do their pitch. We were able to have a small area to display some small quilts and to talk about three. Thank you to Vicki Dods, Philippa Zaph, Dona Mae Bauer, and Val Ursulak for the quilts and Heather Henderson for the placemats. It is now being broadcast on Channel 4, if you get Shaw Cable, for a two week period. The hours are random, but basically twice daily.

We have around 100 prizes ranging from \$10 to \$500.

Hope everyone has fun at the June Quilt Show. Take care!

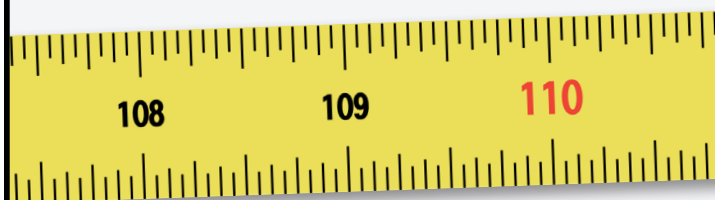

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Minutes of the May 15, 2019 Nanaimo Quilters' Guild Annual General Meeting

President Christine Hustins called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. **Attendance:** There were 80 members present

Moved by Leslie Millward that the minutes of the April 17, 2019 meeting as published in the April newsletter be accepted.
Seconded by Ann Crawford. **Carried.**

Treasurer's report: April 30 total balance \$ 33,405.50, regular account \$ 24,997.60 (deposits \$ 2029.91, cheques issued \$ 2,884.30). Quilt Show account \$ 8,407.90 (deposits \$ 5,795.05, cheques issued \$ 1,301.98). Deposits from Programs and Retreat total \$ 4,000.00. Lija Bane

Committee Reports

Historians: Greta reminded members that next year will be our Guild's 35th anniversary.

2 1/2" wide strips of various darks (reds)

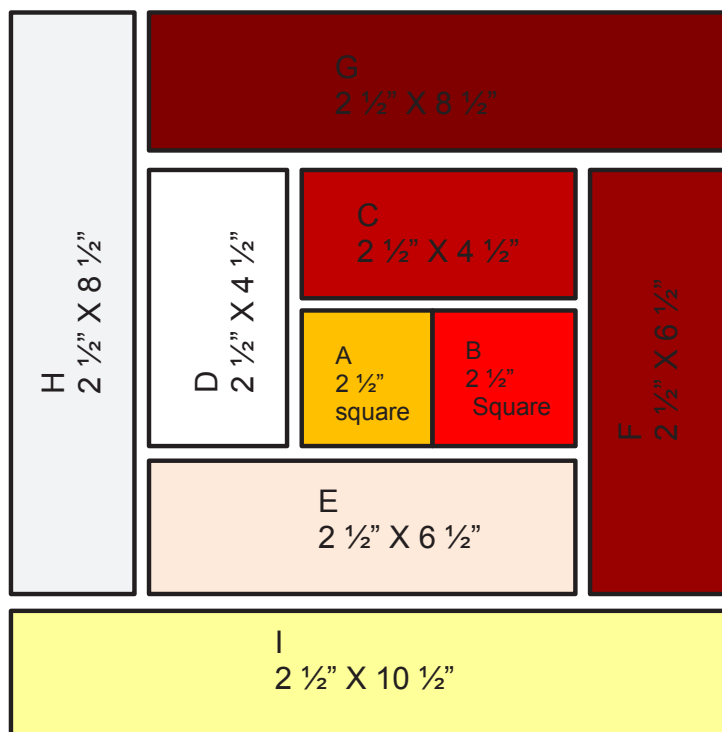
2 1/2" wide strips of lights (white - cream)

8 rows of 6 blocks will give you a quilt about 60" x 80".

No borders needed, just layer, quilt and bind.
