Quilt Show Report

As we go to print, we're on the eve of the show. All the hard work and planning are done now, all is in place. Let the fun begin!

At the last show meeting, the committee decided to dedicate this year's show to the memory of our dear friend and sew sister, Blanche Gates. A long time member who was still quilting at the age of 103, recently passing at 105 years of age. There will also be a memorial Rosette given out in Blanche's name for the show committee's favourite quilt.

On set up day, Thursday June 8, the doors open at the Curling rink at 8 a.m. and everything will get started. Lunch for the workers will be around 12 noon. Vendors will start to arrive at Noon to set up. There will be security in place from 12 noon till 6 p.m. On June 9 the doors will open for the workers at 8:00 a.m. and for the public at 10:00 a.m. with His Worship, The Mayor opening the show with remarks and ribbon cutting (same opening time on Saturday). Visit the Volunteer room on the third floor for rest, relaxation, and snacking. Sunday you will be able to come in around 10:00 to look at the show before the take down starts at 12:30 p.m. Be sure to take a photo of you and your quilt(s). There is no organized lunch on Sunday, so if you are coming early please bring your own lunch. There will be tea, coffee, water available, and possibly left overs from the Volunteer room and Tea Room. Doors close daily at 6:00 o'clock and we should all be ready to leave at that point. The public will be stopped at around 4 o'clock both days.

Bonnie and I hope you will enjoy the show. Many members have worked very hard, for many hours, to get this "show on the road". We hope you have entered something in the show to join in the excitement. Don't forget to vote for your favourites. For the first timers, welcome! We feel that our show is bringing us back up to speed since Covid and we're all looking to follow up the show, with a great new year for our guild. Quilt Show Boutique

By now you have been sewing up a storm, tagging your items and listing them on the inventory sheets and are ready for the drop off on Thursday, June 8th. If you would please check one more time to see if your tags are clearly written, securely fastened with safety pins or thread and if the tag is pinned at the top left corner it would be consistent for customers to see and much appreciated.

On June 8th the Boutique will be open from 9:30 to 11:30 for you to arrive and on a first come/first served basis we will start the process of checking your items in. You must stay with your tote during this process. It will go much quicker if your items are in the same order as they appear on your inventory sheets as our volunteers will be cross checking between the tag and inventory sheet that all items are accounted for. Once they are accounted for you will sign your inventory sheets and you are then free to go. If you are bringing props please put your name and guild number on the prop so that it can be returned to you. If directions are needed please write them on a sheet of paper and leave in your tote. Also your tote should have your name and guild number on it, both bottom and lid please.

On Sunday morning between 9:30 and 11:30 we will reverse the process and on a first come/first served basis we will go through your unsold items and cross check the tag to the inventory sheet to ensure that all unsold items are being returned to you. Once they are accounted for you will sign your inventory sheets again and you are then free to go. This process will take longer as the items will not be in order so please be patient with our volunteers.

The Guild Treasurer will be issuing cheques once all the paper work has been tallied and submitted to her.

Quilt Show Raffle Tickets

Reminder that tickets can still be sold up till the Saturday of the Quilt Show. Anyone wanting more tickets can get in touch with me. Voting at the Quilt Show

Here is a final reminder about your ballots. All Volunteer members will proceed to the Volunteer area to pick up their lanyards. In the lanyard will be your name tag, your Viewer's Choice ballot, and your Secret Categories ballot. Non-volunteer members and the general public will receive their Viewer's Choice ballot when they come through Admissions.

Viewer's Choice: This is a simple white ballot with two choices each for three categories: your favourite large quilt, your favourite small quilt and favourite other item. Record the quilt number which is found on the quilt tag: white for large, blue for small and orange for other. That entry which receives the most votes overall is the **Best of Show** and receives the CQA (Canadian Quilters' Association) Ribbon.

The two categories with the most entries will receive 1st, 2nd and 3rd place ribbons for solo entries and for duo entries. The remaining eight categories will receive 1st, 2nd and 3rd place ribbons according to the number of votes received. The **duo** entries will have a duo ribbon attached.

Secret Categories: Members only will vote for the 6 categories on the green ballot. Volunteer members will find their ballot in their name tag. Non volunteer members may pick up their ballots at the Information

Table. Winners receive a lime green ribbon.

Past Presidents: The Past Presidents, members and non-members, will pick up their Information Package with their lanyards, name tag, past presidents ballot, list of eligible quilts and location map at the Information Table. The non-member PP's may also sign there for a Viewer's Choice ballot and a Secret Categories ballot if they wish to. The PP ballots are pink and the PP Awards are also pink.

Show Committee Ballot: Show Committee Members will find this single ballot in their lanyards with their other ballots. This is tallied with the Viewer's Choice ballots. This year, there will be a memorial Rosette given out in Blanche Gates' name for the show committee's favourite quilt.

Balloting closes at noon on Saturday, June 10, 2023

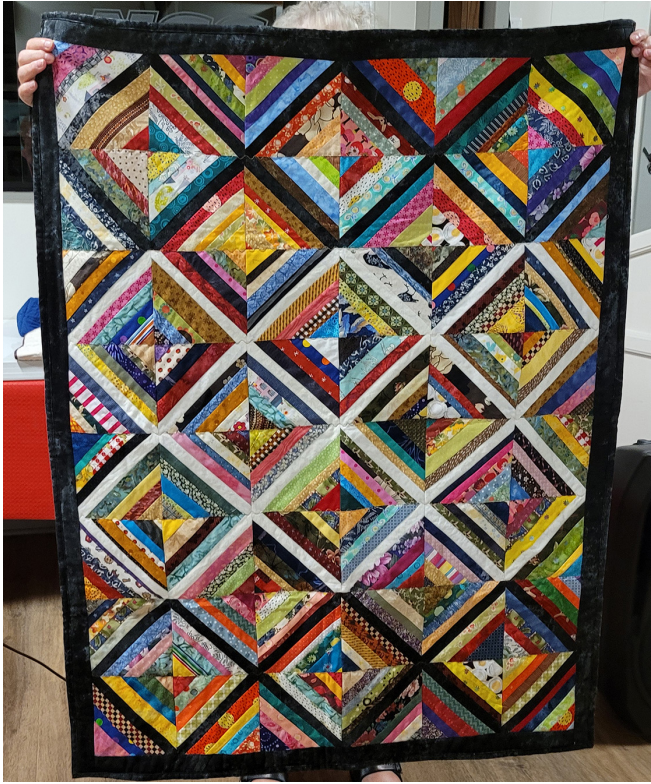
