## Placemats

We had 13 placemats turned in at the May meeting for a total of 266 placemats in stock along with 6 tea cozies and 2 "table runners".

From September to December 2025, we received 162 placemats and 12 tea cozies. Added to stock at the end of Guild year in 2025, we had a total of 437 placemats and 37 tea cozies for our December donations.

In December we donated 400 placemats and 37 tea cozies to Meals on Wheels in Nanaimo, Ladysmith and Gabriola Island and the Salvation Army Hamper Program.

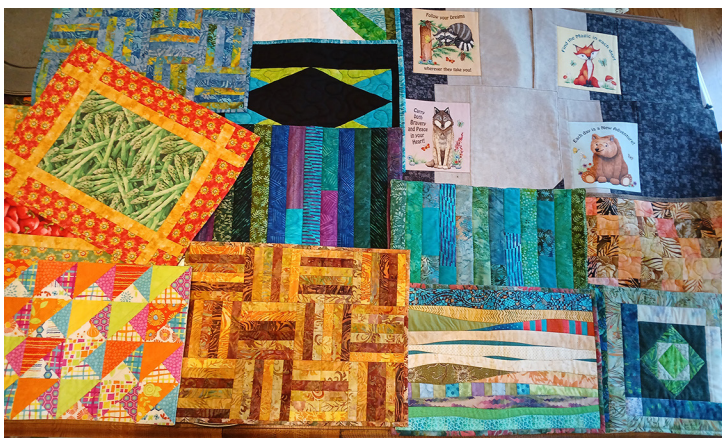
We started off 2026 with 37 placemats in stock.

My congratulations to all the ladies who made fidget quilts this year. I have delivered a total of 61 quilts to the hospital. Each one is folded, placed in a plastic bag and then the patient's name is put on the bag to prevent loss and then it can be taken home once they are discharged.

The Parksville Guild is also participating in this project so the hospital will have enough supplies through the summer months. I hope you will make some during the summer so that we can restock the hospital cupboard in September/October. The Elder Care Foundation supplied the cupboard for the hospital.

I would ask that some of these quilts have a more "manly" theme. I use more of a sporting theme along with foods, animals and other activities that men may appreciate. A little bit of lace is fine as it may bring back memories of a mother or wife.

I hear that some members have now made these quilts for family members of friends and even a classroom at a school to calm an upset child. The benefits for patients have been immense but these quilts have so many applications.

Keep making them this summer. I will again bring items in for members to use sometime in the fall as well. Great job, ladies. *Nancy Lutes*

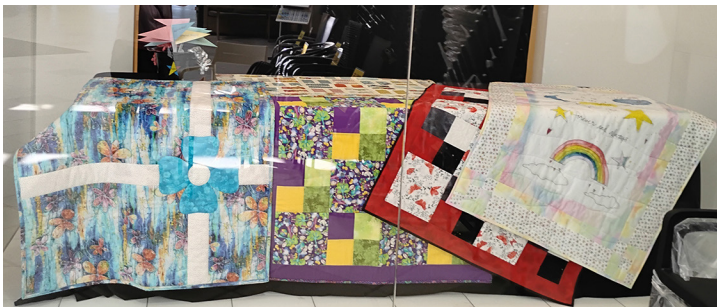

Pattern Poole uses Crazy Patchwork techniques to create flowers for a 10" block from small scraps at: <https://www.patternpoole.com/post/free-quilt-as-you-go-along-part-8-crazy-patchwork-flower-block>

This can be used to design a quilt of flowers or can be part of a free BOM group which uses 2 flower blocks and then moves on to different blocks. Your scrap pile will love this!

Krista Moser used two packages of crumbs (2½" squares) to create a quilt in her May 24th Blog: <https://www.kristamoser.com/post/backed-into-a-corner> This is a great way to use crumbs or your 2 ½" squares.

Paradise Quilters Summit begins June 8-15 with classes

every day. The theme is Fast-N-Easy with 29 complete projects. Follow a schedule to choose the classes you want to view. They will be available for 48 hours afterwards so you are not stuck to a schedule. These classes are free, preregister at: <https://masteryroute.com/quilters/>

Did you admire the hand applique quilts at the Show? Tula Pink highlighted a product that provides a firm base for hand sewing applique. The paper provides more stability when turning under the edges. She raved about the smooth edges formed on a Kim McLean project she is working on. The material is HNK Applique Paper (sold in Canada \$28/20 pieces). Tula says it is not faster or easier to use, but it is firm to work with and the paper will dissolve when machine washed. The paper can be cut with a Cricut, which is very useful when needing circles. Watch Tula: <https://www.facebook.com/tulapink>

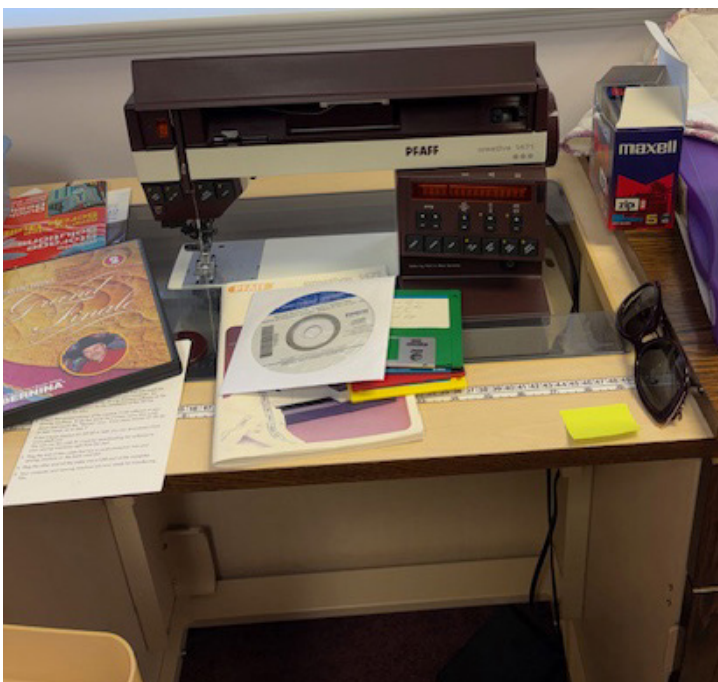


## Wee Tommy's Wood Studio

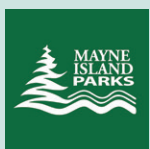
