The Textiles of Bali (Barb Alexander), Quilting with Rulers (Snip and Stitch), Garage Sale, Trunk Show (Val Ursalak), Underground Railway Secret Quit Code (Gerrie Green)

Workshops: There are four workshops planned this year.

October 20: Sliced Circles with Ionne McCauley website: <u>https://www.ionnequilts.com</u>

Circles are among the most satisfying shapes to work with and the combination of circles and straight lines is exciting. Play with great, favourite fabrics and create a wall hanging sized art quilt top, while you learn about shapes and lines and designs. Quilting options are discussed for your finished project.



November 17: Free Motion Quilting with Vicki Dods

Morning: Enjoy a half-day session of free motion quilting. Become familiar with several all over designs as well as repetitive patterns useful for borders and sashings. The session is aimed at beginning level free motion quilters.

Afternoon: Feather play is the theme of the afternoon session. Learn various methods to create feather motifs. Then explore all over designs, shape fillers, border patterns and feathers with graceful, curving spines. This session would suit those who have some experience with free motion work. Members are welcome to attend one or both of the workshops. February 23, 2019: Felting with Nancy Wesley website: www.nancdesigns.ca

Spend four hours of the day learning needle felting techniques with Nancy. Your finished project will be an 8 inch bunny rabbit.

The remainder of the day is devoted to playing with felting. Materials will be provided and you can use your creativity to create another critter or to try your hand at a scene.

March 23, 2019 Surprise Step by Step: *Guess Who's Coming to Dinner?*

Complete a mystery quilt in one class! The project will be a



table runner and coaches will be available to offer assistance. This promises to be a fun day. Four fabrics are required and you will receive pre cutting instructions prior to class.

OTHER EVENTS

All Year Long: Mystery Quilt: Don't miss out on this year's mystery quilt experience. Your registration fee includes the pattern and at each Guild meeting you will receive the next step in creating *Mystery on the 'Oriental' Express*. The final product is a lap quilt or wall hanging measuring 55.5" square before borders. Three fabrics are required: a light (2 yards), medium (1 yard) and dark or bright (1 ³/₄ yards), plus binding (3/4- 1 yard) and binding (2 yards). Sorry about "yards" but it is a US pattern. If you wish to make a larger quilt (55.5" x 82") purchase 1.5 times the fabric required and make 1.5 times the blocks. Borders and binding may be purchased after the mystery has been solved but more of the same fabrics may not be available at that time.

Mini UFOs: Set aside December 1 or April 13 for completing Christmas projects or putting the final touches on your Quilt Show entry. Or, if you are really organized, start something new. Whatever you choose to do enjoy quilting with friends and bring something to share for a pot luck lunch.

Garage Sale: February 13. One person's trash is someone else's treasure. Rent a table with a friend and move along your no longer needed quilting supplies. Number of tables will be limited. Whether you are a seller or a shopper this will be a fun day.

CQA Quilting Challenge for June 2019

Quilting Goes Viral is the theme. All entries must follow the guidelines at <u>canadianquilter.com/member-guild-challenge-2019/</u>. Each individual Member Guild may select one winner only from their Guild's membership, on or before April 30, 2019 for entry into this challenge.

Guilds wishing to enter the Challenge must advise of their intent via email to Bonnie Rankin, rankinbon@gmail.com by Feb 1, 2019, so that space allocation can be arranged.

All mini quilts must be received by May 15 - May 25, 2019

Use Pantone colour #18 ultraviolet or equivalent Kona colour, Bright Periwinkle, along with up to two (2) additional colours

on the face of your quilt. The quilt perimeter is to be no larger than 72". The quilt must be finished with binding, facings or enveloped pillow case style style. Please ensure there is a hanging sleeve, at least 3" wide for display purposes, and a label stating the quilt's name and your name. The chosen entry from each Guild must have the completed Guild entry form included when the quilt is shipped. Barbara Clement

In September you can pick up our Halloween fabric for the block due in October. With the next block we are going modern with a flying geese block from <u>colorgirlquilts.com</u> with one side grey, the other side white with quilter's choice of geese colour in the middle. Next we'll be doing Bonnie Hunter's Pineapple Blossom using fall colours. No block due in December and in January we hand out the Valentine's Day fabric. For a fun fruit block we will be doing a pieced Strawberry block. For those who like butterflies and are willing to try another Y seam we are going retro with <u>www.</u> <u>mccallsquilting.com</u>'s Butterfly block owned by Janet Lyles. It was originally published in 1936. We'll be going with a spring palette for the butterflies with a white background. And lastly we'll be doing a block Becky designed for a Canadian Flag block. I am so looking forward to seeing what you do with the blocks.

2019 Viewer's Choice Ballot and the Call to Entry Categories

The 2019 Viewer's Choice Ballot is the simplified one from 2016. On it you will have two choices for Bed Quilts, two for Wall Hangings, and two for Other. All members will also receive a Secret Categories ballot.

When the Viewer's Choice ballots are counted, votes will be assigned to the nine categories from the Call To Entry Form. The nine categories are: Bed Quilt, Art Quilt, Applique Quilt, Large Wall Hanging (over 200" in perimeter), Small Wall Hanging (under 200" in perimeter), Modern Quilt and Other. Each Category will receive 1st, 2nd and 3rd place ribbons. The entry which receives the most votes overall will receive the Best of Show ribbon from the Canadian Quilters Association.

All the Volunteer members will receive their Viewer's Choice ballot and their Secret Categories ballot with their volunteer lanyards. The lanyards will be picked up at the Volunteer Room. Members not working in the show will receive a Viewer's Choice ballot when going through Admissions. They will go to the Information table to sign for their Secret Categories ballot.
