Placemats

These have been strange times. I sure miss our meetings and wonder just when we will be able to meet again and conduct the business of the guild. At the end of our last meeting in February we had a total of 141 placemats and 59 tea cozies. I suspect (and hope) everyone has had some time to continue to make guilts and placemats for donation. During the lockdown I organized all my scraps and made 13 placemats to donate and some quilts as well. That was one good outcome from the pandemic, I suppose. My concern then became collecting donation items if there are no meetings and then what about the usual donations we give at Christmas. We normally donate to Meals-on-Wheels in Nanaimo and Ladysmith and the Salvation Army. Last year we donated a total of 240 placemats and 65 tea cozies. I have contacted the Salvation Army and they still plan to do their Christmas Hamper Program and will be accepting donations. They will just have to be delivered early and left to sit for a few days. The contact for Meals-on-Wheels will get back to me regarding accepting our placemats this year and the protocol to follow. We still have a few months to go so it will depend on how this pandemic goes.

I hope everyone is staying safe and healthy and quilting up a storm. Your Placemat Committee will be signing on for another year and thanks you all for your hard work at making and donating these beautiful placemats and tea cozies.

Homewood notified us of the protocols required in order to be in operation. We would have been assigned to cohort groups of 4 people and would have needed to dine together, have adjacent sewing stations and would room near one another during the retreat. We were also advised all retreat activities we normally enjoyed could happen only if we adhered to the "2 meter" socially distancing rule for everyone not in the 4 person cohort. Activities severely impacted would be Show and Share, evening games/activities, daily demos, yoga and basically just visiting with anyone outside our 4 person group. We felt the experience would not have been very enjoyable.

The good news is that Homewood has reserved the Nov 1-6 dates in 2021 for us. Most registrants elected to leave their deposit with us and hope for the best for 2021.
