For this time I was drawn to a new site to me called Stash Bee. They have a nice step by step tutorial for this block called Hive 8. The link is <u>Hive 8 tutorial</u> The block is unfinished 16.5 x 16.5. The instructions have a YouTube clip from Missouri Star Quilting for the Double Square Star however remember the sizing is a bit bigger and they've added an extra piece to the block. It uses 4 focus fabrics and 1 background fabric. My two blocks turned out super cute. I hope you enjoy making it. If you run into problems contact me.

# Making a difference

Many of you know Marlene Jones, a long time member of our Guild. Here is an article reprinted from the Children's Health Foundation of Vancouver Island Summer 2021 newsletter.

#### "Handmade gifts with lifelong meaning"

"Families staying at Jeneece Place\* have been taking home beautiful, handmade quilts since 2012—thanks to dedicated volunteers like Nanaimo's Marlene Jones!

Marlene discovered her love of quilting when she moved to Africa for her husband's job. "A friend really got me going on quilting, doing bright African batiks and putting colours together that I'd never thought of."

When they moved back to Canada, Marlene joined the Nanaimo Quilters' Guild, who made donations to Ronald McDonald House. When Jeneece Place opened, Marlene had an idea. "We had followed the story of Jeneece as a young child," Marlene says. "I thought, well this is closer to home...why don't I take some quilts to Jeneece Place?"

As of September 2020, she's donated 500 quilts. At a value of \$125 per quilt, that makes her gift-in-kind contribution an incredible \$62,500! More than that, people are so touched that a stranger has taken the time to make a meaningful memento of their stay. Thank you for your wonderful contribution Marlene! "

\* Jeneece Place is a home where children and their families can stay while receiving medical care in Victoria.

Envisioned by Jeneece Edroff and owned and operated by Children's Health Foundation, Jeneece Place is located on the Victoria General Hospital grounds, housing 10 bedrooms; a kitchen; dining, living and play rooms; and a backyard where kids can feel at home.
