We will spend the day together sewing and laughing. We will play and experiment. You may not finish the day with a quilt, but you will definitely be ahead of the game creatively. Saturday, December 3, 9am to 3:30pm Melissa Marginet: BREAK IT UP! 9 Ways to Quilt As You Go (On Zoom) There are so many ways you can quilt as you go. You will learn several ways, starting off with the basic Sashing method by making samples to have in your studio for future reference. We will also look at patterns to see how we can break them up so they can be finished on your home sewing machines. Suitable for all levels.

Saturday, March 11, 2023, 9am to 3:30pm Elizabeth DeCroos: POJAGI (Korean Stained Glass) Spring Flower Window Panel (On Zoom) Pojagi is the name for an ancient Korean form of stitching that often includes reversible patchwork. If you've ever held a flimsy (quilt top without backing or batting) up to a window, you've probably noticed that it looks like stained glass. But if you've ever tried it, you know there is one problem – raw edges. Elizabeth has adapted the traditional techniques for our modern sewing machines and batik fabrics and solves that rawedge problem with her modern Pojagi seam. She will lead us in this workshop to make window hangings that give the appearance of stained glass and are fully reversible. When students hold up their first piece to a window, the most common reaction is "Wow!" Suitable for all levels. Cheers, Kathleen Kane, 250-802-3323

Our Guild 2022 Challenge ~ Houses

Choose to do a small quilt that speaks to you of your idea of house and home. The quilts will be displayed for voting at the 2022 Christmas meeting. Rules to Play by:

- A quilt must have 3 layers: top, batting and backing.
- · No kit or registration is required.
- Please don't use a commercial pattern. We want to see your ideas!
- You could choose to represent one room or a whole house. Let your imagination run free!
- Embellish as much as you want. Maybe you'll want to choose a holiday theme.
- Finished perimeter to be less than 100", e.g.: a circle smaller than $31\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter, a square smaller than 25" x 25" or a rectangle less than 20" x 30" would qualify.
- · Colour palette and fabrics of your choosing.
- Submit quilt in an opaque bag with your name pinned to the back of the quilt **and** written on the bag. Please include your telephone number.
- Challenge quilt is due by the November meeting. This will allow us time to plan the hanging. An extension may be granted for reasonable grounds.
- There will be no prizes again this year, only ribbons.

Notice of Proposed Constitution & Bylaw Changes for October 2022

Late this past spring outgoing Vice President Nancy Lutes, Vice President Linda Macey and incoming Vice President Vicki Zoltay undertook the task of reviewing the Constitution & Bylaws of the Society and have proposed some amendments to bring these governing documents up to date. The VPs presented their review and suggestions to the Executive Committee who have agreed to offer them to the members for approval at a coming meeting.

The BC Societies Act requires that members are provided at least 30 days notice of proposed changes and therefore we are posting them in this September newsletter, will provide paper copies at the September meeting and will vote on them at our October guild meetings. The rationale for each proposed amendment is offered here and following the required voting procedure there will be opportunity to question and discuss each change individually at the October meeting. Our sincere thanks go to Nancy, Linda and Vicki for the time and thoughtfulness they put into this review.

NQG Executive Committee

Proposed Constitution Change

MOTION:

That section 1 The purposes of the Society, subsection a be amended from:

"To support individuals and agencies in our community through quilt related donations", to:

"To support individuals and agencies in our community and beyond through quilt related donations"

Rationale: Though the original constitution stated the intention to make quilt related donations to the community, the term community was not defined geographically. Over the years, donations have expanded both locally, for example, with the Meals on Wheels programs in Ladysmith and on Gabriola Island, and beyond, as we have responded to emergencies in the province and other places in Canada. Examples of these donations have most recently been for large scale fire or flood victims. In doing a full review it seemed appropriate reflect more accurately the current and anticipated future donation activities.

Proposed Bylaw Changes

MOTION 1:

That Bylaw section 1 Membership, subsection iv be amended from:

"A member shall cease to be in good standing upon

failure to make payment of membership fees within a period of thirty (30) days after due date", to:

"A member shall cease to be in good standing upon failure to make payment of membership fees within a period of sixty (60) days after due date"

Rationale: To offer members a longer opportunity to renew memberships while retaining voting rights. For example, if a member missed the first notice of renewal or first meeting of the year, under the current bylaw their membership could lapse. Offering a 60-day window is suggested as both practical and fitting the goal of minimizing barriers to membership renewals.

MOTION 2:

That Bylaw section 3 Quorum, subsection iii, be deleted.

"Expenditures over \$1000 must be taken as a motion to the membership for a ballot vote"

Rationale: This requirement is in a few inappropriate locations in the bylaws. It only belongs under the section "6 Expenditures not budgeted" so it is being suggested it be removed from the sections which speak to other matters including this section referencing what constitutes a quorum. Proposed motion #6 moves it into the correct section.

MOTION 3:

That Bylaw section 4 Voting, subsection iii be deleted.

"Expenditures over \$1000 must be taken as a motion to the membership for a ballot vote"

Rationale: This requirement is in a few inappropriate locations in the bylaws. It only belongs under the section "6 Expenditures not budgeted" so it is being suggested it be removed from the sections which speak to other matters including this section which lays out how voting is to be conducted. Proposed motion #6 moves it into the correct section.

MOTION 4:

That Bylaw section 6 Expenditures Not Budgeted, subsection i, be amended from:

"The directors of the Society may authorize the payment of expenditures up to \$300, before taxes, per submission, for items not included in a current budget", to:

"A majority of the directors of the Society may authorize the payment of expenditures up to \$500, before taxes, per submission for items not included in a current budget"

Rationale: Very rarely, there may arise a need to promptly pay an unplanned budget item over the current

\$300 limit. This change enables the directors of the Society, which include the executive and some of the standing committee chairs, (11 people in total) to make the decision to authorize up to \$500. While this increase in the limit wouldn't require membership approval the extraordinary expense would be reported to the membership during the monthly financial report.

MOTION 5:

That Bylaw section 6 Expenditures Not Budgeted, be amended to include:

Subsection ii, "That expenditures not included in a current budget of between \$501 and \$1000, before taxes, be taken as a motion to the membership for a vote by show of hands"

Rationale: Currently there is no reference to how to handle an unplanned expenditure between \$300 (In the case that motion #4 is approved this moves to \$500) and items over \$1000. The inclusion of this subsection would cover that gap by requiring any unplanned expense between the two levels be brought to the membership for a vote by a show of hands.

MOTION 6:

That Bylaw section 6 Expenditures Not Budgeted, be amended to include:

Subsection iii, That expenditures not included in a current budget of over \$1000, before taxes, be taken as a motion to the membership for a ballot vote.

Rationale: This motion was in a few inappropriate locations in the existing bylaws but should be referenced in this section which speaks to how to handle any unplanned expenditures during a guild/budget year.

MOTION 7:

That Bylaw section 8 Duties of Executive Officers, subsection vi, d, be amended from:

"Chair a budget committee made up of the President(s), immediate Past President(s), Treasurer(s), and immediate Past Treasurer(s)", to:

"Chair a budget meeting made up of the President(s), immediate Past President(s), Treasurer(s), immediate Past Treasurer(s), Secretary and committee chairs"

Rationale: This change provides for the budget process to be referenced as a meeting, rather than a committee, which more accurately describes the process. It also proposes that more members in leadership roles be included in the meeting. The committee chairs are asked to provide information for the budget but have traditionally been excluded from the discussion and final budget to be presented to the membership for approval.

These changes are collectively proposed to improve openness and inclusivity in the budget process.

MOTION 8:

That Bylaw section 8 Duties of Executive Officers, subsection vi, h, be amended from:

"Liaise with the Committees and ensure that proper procedures are being followed by them", to:

"Liaise with the Committees and ensure that proper procedures are being followed"

Rationale: This is a grammar change not intended to affect the intention of the subsection.
