Get into the holiday spirit with Christmas fabrics, festive projects, and seasonal decorations.

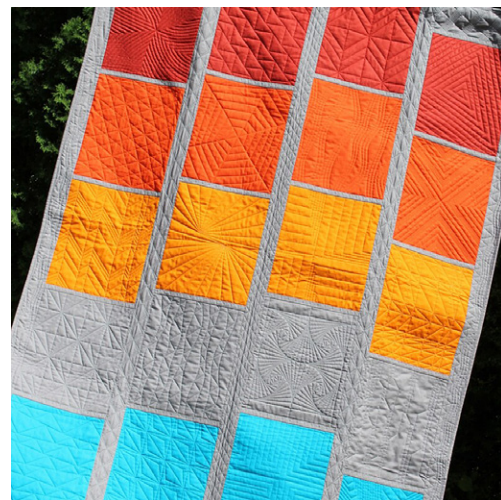
Whether you're finishing a Christmas quilt, working on holiday gifts, or simply tackling a UFO that has been waiting too long, this is a great opportunity to make progress.

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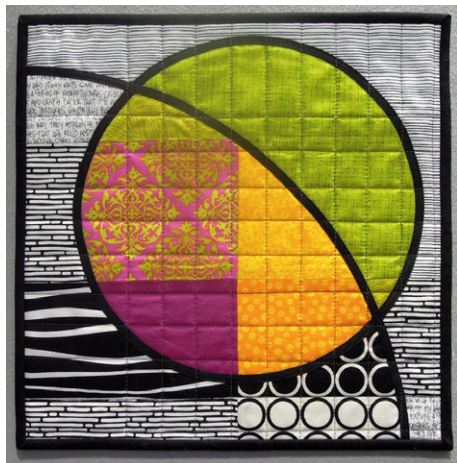

Kathy Wylie Window Boxes: Inset Thread Lace
September 26 9:15-4:00, Cordova Bay 55+, 5238
Cordova Bay Rd. Victoria Cost: \$75.00

Enhance your quilts with the exquisite detail of inset thread lace. In this class, you'll master the technique of creating a simple hand-embroidered thread lace grid and learn how to insert it between the turned-edge holes of a quilt project. You'll start by making a three-inch practice window box using the provided kit fabric and embroidery floss (Kit - \$20). Then, you'll move on to a five-block project using your own fabric and floss. Three optional Window Box patterns are available for purchase.

Quilters' Chat

It is the start of a new year of quilting! I hope you had a good rest from the Quilt Show and are ready to get started on a new creative endeavour.

I came across a pattern for a very small jewelry case for traveling, great for earrings, necklaces and rings. I have reduced the amount of jewelry I wear so this was a good fit for me. There are many Youtube versions, search Mini travel jewelry pouch pattern. I found this one on a website with good instructions and a free pdf pattern: <https://hellosewing.com/mini-travel-jewelry-pouch/> AND, if you need a snap fastener check out Serge and Sew where you can buy a small bag and don't need a tool to connect the two parts.

McCalls Quilting Fall 2026, available free online through the library, has the cutest dragon. It is paper pieced. The article uses the dragon as a pocket on a towel, but the block could be used in many ways including varying the colours in each block to make a baby/toddler quilt.

Do you have a layer cake (10" squares) of a child's print? I did so and made a Krista Moser quilt. With two co-ordinating colours and easy instructions this was quick to put together. Her "Layered Up" quilt is a great baby quilt. <https://www.kristamoser.com/post/layered-up>

Many people are not aware of the wealth of quilting and other crafting resources available for free through the CreativeBug section of our Vancouver Island Regional Library system. You sign in using your library card number and PIN and once you're there, you'll find videos on all manner of crafting including yarn, sewing, needlework, art & design, jewelry, and others. In the quilting section alone, there are over 150 videos on every quilting topic you can imagine, from the history of quilting, the basics of patchwork and jelly roll quilts, colour theory, appliqué, freezer paper piecing, ruler work, free motion quilting, specific blocks and quilt patterns and more, presented by well-known quilters such as Sarah Bond, Heidi Parkes and Sherri Lynn Wood. The videos range from 1 minute on how to make a quilter's knot, through to multi-hour, multi-lesson sessions. Prepare to be amazed.

From the main VIRL screen virl.bc.ca go to the Learn menu, then click on the Research tab then scroll down to DIY & Crafts.

The sewing machine is on, the iron is hot, it must be time to get back to quilting..... *Ellen Ellis*
