Our November program is Toronto's Peter Byrne presenting his "Behind the Seams" Virtual Trunk Show. His presentation will be part of our regular meeting on Wednesday, November 17 at 7 pm, right after our 6:30 Zoom social time, and before the business meeting starts. Check out his website at peterbquilts.com and prepare to be WOW-ed! There might just be one of his workshops in the planning, so stay tuned.

The next event is the FUNdamentally Circles WORKSHOP - our first ever virtual offering - on Saturday, October 30. There has already been a separate email notice about it and the information is repeated here. Register early to avoid disappointment.

Description: In this workshop, the focus will be on the core technique of freeform piecing circular designs without pins and templates. It's liberating and it's FUN. - The quilt perimeter is to be no larger than 96".
- · Each quilt must be finished with either binding, facings, or enveloped pillow-case style
- . There must be a hanging sleeve, at least 3 inches wide, for display purposes.
- All quilts must have a label on the back with the quilt name and quilter's name visible on it.

Entry Guidelines

- Open to Individual, Professional & Shop CQA/ACC members.
- Entries will be accepted through an online entry form on the CQA/ACC website January 3-April 30, 2022.
- When the online entry form has been received by CQA/ACC, a confirmation email with instructions for shipping the quilt will be sent to the entrant.
- All quilts must be received by May 30, 2022 so they can be displayed at Quilt Canada 2022 being held at the Vancouver Convention Centre, June 16-18, 2022.
- The winning quilt will be selected by Viewers' Choice and awarded a \$100 cash prize.

The "REAFFIRM" CQA/ACC Member Guild Quilt Challenge 2022 info also here

- Please choose fabric colours that represent your province or territory, and add a "touch of red" fabric to the quilt front.
- The quilt perimeter is to be no larger than 72 inches.
- Each quilt must be finished with either binding, facings, or enveloped pillow-case style.
- There must be a hanging sleeve, at least 3 inches wide, for display purposes.
- All quilts must have a label on the back with the quilt name and quilter's name visible on it.
- Each CQA/ACC Member Guild selects one winner only from their Guild's membership, before April 30, 2022 for entry into this challenge.
- CQA/ACC will select entries from both the Individual Member "Rewire" Challenge and the Member Guild "Reaffirm" Challenge to participate in a travelling show from July 2022 to June 2023. If your entry is selected for the travelling show, you will be notified and your quilt will be returned to you in June 2023.
- The travelling show will be carried out in Atlantic Canada as a promotion for Quilt Canada 2023 in Halifax. Our Eastern Regional Reps and/or Board members will take the quilts to Guilds and/or shops in their province to share the talents of our members.



Quilt needs completion to complete Ida Schultz' story



On September 15, Steven and Shiona Northway dropped by the Curling Club parking lot to donate 30 Dresden Plate blocks, shown above, hoping on of our members might complete a quilt begun many years ago by Steven's great grandmother, Ida Schultz. What follows is an amazing story.

She was born Ida Cecelia Sjoblom in 1885 to Swedish immigrants who had settled in McCulley Township, Nebraska. She met and married Louis Schultz, an immigrant from Germany who was traveling through to the Dakota territories, when she was eighteen years old. Louis had been granted a homestead in the Black Hills that was later rescinded when it came to light that the US government had made these land grants in violation of treaties with the Sioux people.

Our great grandfather had a trade; he was a blacksmith, so they moved into the small town of Dixon, not far from the Rosebud Reservation, where he established a successful business. Ida would brag that they owned the first automobile in the town, a Brush. Ida had five children, our grandmother Lila Rose being the oldest.

Her life in what became South Dakota was a true pioneer life. Ida never talked about how hard it was, but her daughter, our grandmother, would tell tales of diapers draped all over the cabin, frozen solid in the winter cold. She endured tragedy when a son drowned in a well. Our grandmother remembered riding home in their wagon, Ida cradling the boy's head in her lap.

By 1930 the entire Schultz family had joined the great Dust Bowl migration to California. They settled in El Centro, close to the Mexican border and Ida spent the next forty years in Southern California. Her two living sons served in WWII and her husband built another successful business selling tires and repairing cars. It was during this period of her life that she had the time and resources to devote herself to craft. She made

many quilts, but was proudest of her braided rugs, which won prizes at the San Diego County Fair. Grandma said she would buy men's suit coats at the Goodwill and rummage sales to repurpose the wool in those rugs.

After the death of our grandfather Fred Rhodes, Lila's husband, Ida joined Lila in Santa Cruz, California, where they lived together with Ruby, Ida's youngest daughter until Ida's death in 1978. In her old age she took up crochet and we remember her always with a hook in her hand and an afghan forming in her lap. She also dabbled in needlepoint. Craft was her outlet and means of expression through all the years we knew her.

We don't know why Ida didn't finish the Dresden Plate quilt, just as we don't know when she started it. Our grandmother always intended to finish it and when she died our mother thought she would, but they were not quilters and these three generations of women may have had qualms about the difficulty of the design and the scope of the work. We are so happy to pass it on to a group that will honor it and bring it life.

Written by Chris Northway Ziemkiewicz (Steven Northway's sister), the last in my line to pass on the challenge of these squares, even though I am a very enthusiastic quilter myself. Thank you all.

From Donation Quilts: There are 10 completed blocks, with 20 more laid out and pinned to the background squares. The completed 'plates' have been hand appliqued on the inside and outside edges. The fabrics are a fantastic vintage selection.
