Scraps vs Scrappy Thursday, October 6, 7pm (on Zoom)

Our talk this month is a virtual lecture and trunk show by Cheryl Arkison who will show you all the pleasures of using your scraps. It starts with sorting and storing then moves onto the many, many ways to use every last piece of fabric. This will hopefully entice you to register for her upcoming guild virtual workshop, Scraptastic. (See details below.) Cheryl is the author of three books: Sunday Morning Quilts, co-authored with Amanda Jean Nyberg, A Month of Sundays, and You Inspire Me To Quilt. Cheryl lives in Calgary with her husband and three active kids.

Saturday, October 22, 10 - 4 \$35 Cheryl Arkison: SCRAPTASTIC (On Zoom) Don't throw away your little scraps! Those little bits and pieces have excellent potential. This class will show you how to use every last scrap. We will discuss sorting and storing in addition to numerous exercises to truly embrace your scraps.

We will spend the day together sewing and laughing. We will play and experiment. You may not finish the day with a quilt, but you will definitely be ahead of the game creatively. Suitable for all levels.

Saturday, December 3, 9 - 3:30 \$30 Melissa Marginet: BREAK IT UP! 9 Ways to Quilt As You Go (On Zoom) There are so many ways you can quilt as you go. You will learn several ways, starting off with the basic Sashing method by making samples to have in your studio for future reference. We will also look at patterns to see how we can break them up so they can be finished on your home sewing machines. Suitable for all levels.

Saturday, March 11, 2023, 9 - 3:30 Elizabeth DeCroos: POJAGI (Korean Stained Glass) Spring Flower Window Panel \$40 (On Zoom) Pojagi is the name for an ancient Korean form of stitching that often includes reversible patchwork. If you've ever held a flimsy (quilt top without backing or batting) up to a window, you've probably noticed that it looks like stained glass. But if you've ever tried it, you know there is one problem - raw edges. Elizabeth has adapted the traditional techniques for our modern sewing machines and batik fabrics and solves that raw-edge problem with her modern Pojagi seam. She will lead us in this workshop to make window hangings that give the appearance of stained glass and are fully reversible. When students hold up their first piece to a window, the most common reaction is "Wow!" Suitable for all levels. *Kathleen Kane*, 250-802-3323

Our Guild 2022 Challenge ~ Houses

Choose to do a small quilt that speaks to you of your idea of house and home. The quilts will be displayed for voting at the 2022 Christmas meeting. Rules to Play by:

- A quilt must have 3 layers: top, batting and backing.
- No kit or registration is required.
- Please don't use a commercial pattern. We want to see your ideas!
- You could choose to represent one room or a whole house. Let your imagination run free!
- Embellish as much as you want. Maybe you'll want to choose a holiday theme.

• Finished perimeter to be less than 100", e.g.: a circle smaller than $31\frac{1}{2}$ " in diameter, a square smaller than 25" x 25" or a rectangle less than 20" x 30" would qualify.

• Colour palette and fabrics of your choosing.

• Submit quilt in an opaque bag with your name pinned to the back of the quilt **and** written on the bag. Please include your telephone number.

• Challenge quilt is due by the November meeting. This will allow us time to plan the hanging. An extension may be granted for reasonable grounds.

• There will be no prizes again this year, only ribbons.


