FUNdamentally Circles Workshop

Our first ever virtual workshop was held on October 30th with 14 eager students learning how to freeform piece quarter circle blocks without pins. Brenda Gael Smith of Serendipity Patchwork & Quilting in Sydney Australia gave us 3 hours of FUN and inspiration and showed how freeing it is to ditch the templates and pins and use improv methods to create one-of-a kind blocks that can be sliced and diced to make even more creative forms.

The virtual format meant each student could work from the comfort of their own space and everyone had a front row seat. (see screen shot photos of workshop below)


We have had two twin size quilt tops donated by Laurie Webster, which need to be quilted and bound. Please contact us if you are interested in doing this.


If we do not meet in person, we will again be accepting quilts in the curling rink parking lot between 1 and 2 pm on that day. Batting, backing and labels will be available.

Block of the Month Sew-Along

I hope you enjoyed working on the Halloween Candy block. I got my blocks sewn together, then changed my mind about one of the fabric choices. Reminder to audition fabrics before cutting! That's my tip of the day. Lol. I'm looking forward to adding this block to my Halloween quilt.

This month's block is inspired by the turning of the leaves. We have done a leaf block in the past but I found a neat looking leaf from September 21, 2020 on Marie's Quilt Bee <u>blog spot website</u> https://rie-quiltbee.blogspot.com/2020/09/the-leaves-are-beginning-to-turn.html. Marie lives in Pembroke, Ontario. The block is 7 1/2" unfinished. I was lucky to find a number of red 2" strips in my red scraps container so was able to use different fabrics for this block. In my sample I didn't put in a stem as her pattern directed. I followed her directions for making the main leaf point but you can use your favourite technique for that block. Her template, for example, could be used as a paper piecing unit.

Terri received some prizes from Island Sewing Centre in Campbell River so there's a possibility of having a draw for participation. Although we will be trying to get back to in person meetings I know some of you won't be able to go to the meetings and I would hate to exclude you from a chance to win. Terri has agreed to mail out prizes to the winner. Also let me know if you would like to go back to a block draw program or just continue with a sew along program. I'll also ask for a show of hands at

the in person quilt meeting. The deadline for posting the pictures will be the day before the meetings. I hope this works out as I would love to see your blocks.


