## DID YOU KNOW?

## Good Friends, Good Food, Good Cheer!

The December Guild meeting has traditionally been our time to sit back, relax and enjoy food and conversation with our quilting friends, both old and new.

Originally, our Christmas Pot Luck started out as a Christmas Social. In 1985, one of the members volunteered to host the social in her home. Members brought appetizers to snack on and a wrapped handmade Christmas ornament for a gift exchange.

In 1987, a room was rented at Beban Park and featured a Pot Luck Dinner and ornament exchange. This was also the first time non-perishable food items were collected. The donation went to the Salvation Army.

When the Guild moved to the Community Services Building in 1991, it was decided to hold the Pot Luck Dinners at the hall. Members were encouraged to bring Christmas theme quilts and wall hangings to decorate the hall and for show and share.

In 1995, the Program Committee issued a "Pretty Placemat Challenge." Members were encouraged to make a Christmas placemat that would be judged at the Pot Luck Dinner. The 49 entries were then donated to Meals on-Wheels to be distributed along with their clients Christmas meals. This was the first placemat donation.

In 2001, it was decided to break with tradition and try something different. The Pot Luck Dinner was moved to January and held at the Wellington Hall. The theme was a *Hawaiian Luau* and members were encouraged to wear their most exotic tropical print clothes. The December meeting was a workshop to make gift bags.

Members brought their sewing machines and made 5" x 8" drawstring bags that were filled with small gifts and toiletries. At the end of the day 147 bags had been made and filled. A large amount of non-perishable food for hampers had been collected. It was decided to give half of the food and 100 gift bags to Nanaimo Family Life for families in need, and the remaining food and 47 gift bags went to Haven House.

In 2002, a bus trip to Victoria was organized which included a dinner and a tour of Butchart Gardens Christmas Light Up. The December meeting was used to make gift bags for 5-Acres Alternative School, and collect food for food hampers. Members also participated in a cookie and ornament exchange. The Pot Luck was held in January at the Wellington Hall.

In 2005, the Pot Luck Dinner was followed by an "Ugly Fabric" auction. The funds raised (\$244.00) was donated to the Local 7-10 Club to help with Christmas hampers.

In 2006, the Pot Luck Dinner was followed by "Quilt Bingo" with the bingo cards made with fabric pieced blocks from the pattern in *Fons & Porter* (September 2006) magazine. Afterwards the cards were donated to Comfort Quilts (as it was called then) to make donation Quilts. This popular game was repeated in 2007, and in 2008 with the blocks that year going to the Haven House Quilt Bee.

In 2010, the Pot Luck Dinner included a scavenger hunt, door prizes, raffle prizes and a voluntary gift exchange. This was the first year that Graham Gates provided musical entertainment.

December 2012 Pot Luck Dinner provided punch and warm apple cider to get the evening started. The ladies from Brechin Church were very helpful and much appreciated.

In 2013, the Pot Luck dinner was held in our new venue at the Nanaimo Curling Club. Once again Graham Gates provided music and Liz Simonson led everyone in a sing along.

Our 2014 Pot Luck Dinner will again include Graham Gates providing musical entertainment. Thank you, Graham for sharing your music with us for 5 years.

# SPCA DOG (AND CAT) BEDS

As I stand in my sewing room, barely able to move through the bags of fabric scraps, I want to thank you all for being so good at collecting your scraps and bringing them in to have another life as dog (and cat) bed stuffing. I have made 8 beds since yesterday and still there is a huge pile of scraps - backlog from the several months I was away. I took four beds in to the SPCA yesterday and by the end of the day I should have another dozen or so to take to them - they are grateful to receive them. Just a few reminders on what can and can't be donated to this cause:

## YES:

Fabric scraps; batting scraps; t-shirts (with necks and arm bands cut out); soft clothing (ONLY if all buttons, collars, cuffs and any other hards bits are removed and the remainder cut into pieces); sheets & other fabric homewares (ONLY if cut into about 10" squares, otherwise they ball up into big lumps). Yes also to large pieces of drapery weight fabric (ugly is okay) which is used for the outside casing.

## NO:

Pins, needles, paper, tear-away, dryer sheets; the shiny backed stuff used in potholders; parts of your husband's underwear; empty thread spools, bobbins, buttons, pills, cookies, kleenex, parts of jeans, etc etc....YES, I have found all of these things in the scrap bags. Please go through your scraps before you hand them in - it is imperative that no foreign objects find their way into the dog bags. I don't want to discourage you from saving your scraps, but I hope you don't mind doing this one extra step please and thank you!!

# **Black Nine Patch Swap**

WOW!!! We had 32 participant is our nine patch swap in November. I continue to be delighted with the response from our Guild members.

This year you have the opportunity to join in a Nine Patch Swap. If you participate every month you will have 72 nine patch blocks of six different colours ready for a quilt.

Here's what you do, bring in 12 identical 6 ½ inches blocks in a zip lock bag with your name and phone number on the bag. I will take the bags home and exchange the blocks with 12 others so you will get 12 different nine patch blocks the next month. Participate every month or on occasional months, it's up to you to decide how often you can join in.

The corner squares and the centre squares are to be the **colour of the month**, in a jewel tone. The four other squares are a **true dark black fabric**. **Serge & Sew** and **Snip and Stitch** both carry Robert Kaufman Kona for approximately \$14.00 per meter and Maywood Black Magic for approximately \$10.75 per meter. I took a look at Fabricland but their black cottons are a blue/black rather than a true black. Kathy of **Snip & Stitch** has offered a discount if you mention that you are purchasing fabric for this project. Please use 100% cotton plain or tone on tone fabric, batiks work well for this project. Please, no printed fabrics.

The amount of fabric required for your 12 identical blocks is 15 inches of 42 inch wide coloured fabric and 12 inched of 42 inch wide black fabric, these measurements are generous. Your fabric will be cut into 2 ½ inch strips for your blocks, five strips of coloured fabric and four strips of black fabric. 
# **December Program Report**

# CQA Report, November 2014

CQA's Quilt Canada biannual conference is coming up in June 2015 in Lethbridge, Alberta. Those who have spent time in Lethbridge will understand how the show came to be named Blown Away. Guilds are again being challenged to guilt our way across Canada by measuring the perimeter inches of items we guilt from September 2014 to June 2015. I will have a jar at each Guild meeting and encourage you all to measure and contribute your quilted inches to this fun challenge. The goal is to reach 197 million inches. the distance from St Catherines ON to Lethbridge AB. Our guild collected 12,000 inches at the November meetings.

NQG has contributed \$250 to CQA to be used as part of the Added Purse prize money in the upcoming show. In supporting this show we also support the talented quilters we have in our guild who enter their work, some of whom are past CQA winners.

At the afternoon meeting I showed members a sample of the tablet bag to be used as a gift to banquet guests at the Lethbridge conference. Guilds across Canada have been invited to make bags to send to CQA for these prizes. I will be sending a couple on behalf of our guild and would be happy to send more if anyone would like to make an extra tablet bag for this event.
