### **Block of the Month**

Norma Steven won the 32 wonderful blocks turned in at the afternoon meeting. Some of the ladies changed out the white fabric in the windows for different patterns (take a closer look at the picture below). There were different roofs and one house entirely out of scraps. I won the 12 evening blocks. That was exciting.

The next block is called Raspberry Kisses, due *in January*. http://heritage-threads.com/2016/09/09/12-raspberry-kiss-block/ It is a 12<sup>1/2"</sup> unfinished block made with 3 colours: a berry or green fabric in the center X, a low volume light in the next area and another low volume light in the outer triangles. A low volume fabric is one whose back ground in light with a small design overlaying it. Just a reminder that when you sew the center X that the 3 pieced squares will have an overhang and the intention is to trim this section to 9". If you want to come by Jonanco on a Monday for help please feel free. There will be a \$6 drop in fee if you are not a Jonanco member. ### **Placemats**

On November 4 we donated 58 placemats to a small, non-profit, registered charity called "Good Cents for Change" for a fundraiser they were having at the Ladysmith United Church hall. The fundraiser, organized by Susan Dobson, consisted of a \$12 luncheon with placemats available for sale at \$5 each, and a silent auction and other activities. The money raised goes to fund tailoring courses, sewing machines, fabric and supplies for young women in Zambia. Susan reported the event was a huge success and raised \$440 from the placemats and a total of over \$1300 from the fundraiser. She asked me to pass along her profound thanks to the Guild for their generosity in providing placemats.

As for statistics: we took in 32 placemats and 2 tea cozies at the November meetings, and so now have a balance of 256 placemats and 23 tea cozies.
