## Business for the General Meeting January 16, 2008

Issues that arose at the Nov. 21, 2007 evening Guild meeting were discussed in great length by the Executive at their December meeting. The membership is to be reminded that this Executive is working extremely hard to the best of our ability and, most importantly, with honourable intentions.

It is the understanding of the Executive that some members who attend evening meetings feel they have little or no input into guild decisions. The following are proposals to address these concerns:

The newsletter will be used as a vehicle of communication for the business of the guild although doing so may create a time lag in dealing with guild business. When a matter of importance comes up after the newsletter deadline has passed we will send out a notice via email. Note that this would not reach all the membership as not everyone has email.

The following MOTIONS will be presented for voting at the January guild meetings:

**1) Any financial expenditures over \$1000.00 will be voted on by the membership in attendance, by paper ballot (one member, one vote) and all the ballots will be counted by a Balloting Committee formed of Executive Members or Designates after the evening meeting. Ballots will be retained for 30 days following the vote after which they will be destroyed. As well, the results of the vote will be posted in the newsletter.**

*Motion passed unanimously by the Executive.*

**2) All matters of a significant nature shall be presented to the Executive, in writing, as a Notice of Motion, and this will in turn be posted in the newsletter and be dealt with at the next executive and general meetings.**

*Motion passed unanimously by the Executive.*

NOTE: the second motion will not apply to ALL motions from the floor. It will be at the discretion of the President(s) at the time of presentation.

Following both the 2001 and 2004 NQG Quilt Shows a Committee was struck to research ideas to spend excess funds the guild has generated with the quilt shows. It was felt in light of the present healthy financial status of the guild a committee of this kind is needed, with a representation of members from both the afternoon and evening meetings. If anyone would be interested in being a member of this committee, please contact either Eimear or Avril.

It was raised that the guild has a cache of coffee, tea, sugar etc. and we propose to offer FREE coffee and tea at the meetings for the remainder of the year.

We are requesting that at our guild meetings all members sign in at the Membership/Hospitality table as they arrive. At that time you will receive your ticket for the Name Tag Draw. If a ballot is being held that day, members will also receive their paper ballot. Signing in will give us an idea of attendance and input for the direction of the guild.

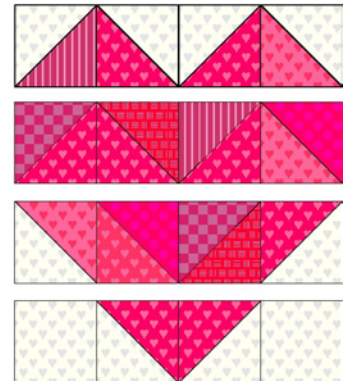


**NQG Block of the Month - February 2008**

Of course we wanted to do a heart block for February. This block is another half-square triangle project and is completely done from scrap reds and white on whites. It looks really great if you use different reds, prints or plains.

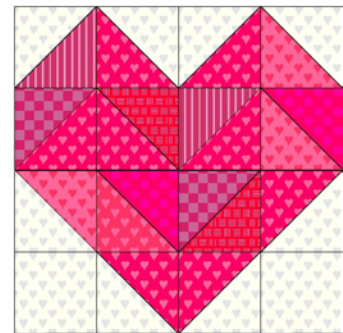
**Cutting Instructions:**

1. Cut 4" blocks: 4 reds and 4 whites. Lay 1 red and 1 white right sides together, 4 times and mark each on the diagonal from corner to corner and sew 1/4" on each side of your marks. Cut along the mark and press open towards the red.
2. Cut 4" blocks: 6 reds. Lay 2 reds right sides together, 3 times and mark each on the diagonal from corner to corner and sew 1/4" on each side of your marks. Cut along the mark and press open.
3. Cut 3 1/2" blocks: 2 white, for two bottom corner blocks.



**Instructions for Piecing:**

Sew the squares together into strips as illustrated and then sew each strip together to form the heart shape. As you will notice on the illustration, not all the blocks are laid out the same, therefore you should lay all the squares out on your table before sewing them together.

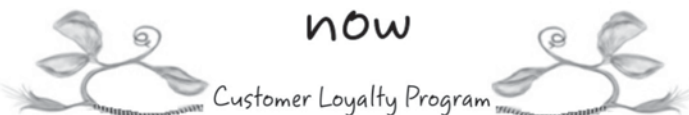
