Zucchini Carrot Loaf

I brought this loaf to the Charlotte Warr Anderson quilt class and many people asked for the recipe. I obtained the recipe from Thrifty Foods website. *Carole Dorward*

3 cups flour2 cups white sugar2 tsp baking powder2 tsp vanilla extract

1 tsp cinnamon 3 large eggs

1/2 tsp nutmeg 1 1/4 cups grated zucchini 1/4 tsp cloves 1 1/4 cups grated carrot

1/2 tsp salt1 cup applesauce3/4 cups walnuts1/2 cup currants

- · Preheat oven to 350 and spray two loaf pans with vegetable oil.
- · Place flour, baking powder, cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves and salt in medium bowl and combine.
- · In a separate large bowl combine applesauce, sugar and vanilla. Beat in eggs one at a time.
- · Add flour mixture and mix just until combined.
- · Stir in zucchini, carrots, walnuts and currants.
- Divide batter between two loaf pans. Bake one hour.
 Cool 10 minutes then unmould and cool to room temperature.





The Green Challenge Continues...

The aspect of a green life continues to ramp up. Every time I go to throw something in the trash, I think...can I repurpose this? I have quite a collection of net bags from oranges and recently have taken to acquiring a selection of things that rust. Lois Jarvis has a demo DVD and website on Rust Dying. It is simple and now you don't have to throw out that rusty colander, nail or iron pan you inherited from great grandma. A little cotton cloth (plain, printed or PFD), from your stash, works well. The Shibori method of wrapping cloth around an old wine bottle is fun and the rust creates brown lines in contrast to the fabric colour. If you add tannin to the mix you will get a grey tone along with the brown. These cloths make great backgrounds for appliqué, a base for further dying or photo transfer. Next month, a link to show you how to use those used tea bags...start saving now. Have fun and as the Latins say "Semper culcitat"...Always Quilting! April Block of the Month

Thanks to all who participated in the February BOTM. You all did a great job! Congratulations to the draw winner, Vivian Scott. With spring and Easter just around the corner I have designed a 12 ½" Easter Basket block using spring colours. As always, give me a call @ 758-1185 if you have any questions about the block.

Cutting and Fabric:

Spring Floral25½" squaresMedium Violet27½" squaresNeutral26¾" squaresSpring Green26¾" squares

Look at the neutral and the spring green squares. Is there a direction to either fabric? If there is, set the squares of the directional fabric right side up on the table with the same "up and down" sense. Place the two squares of the same fabric right sides together. Cut the two layers in half diagonally (corner to corner). Open the piles up and lay the triangles out with the correct up and down sense. You should have two left and two right triangles. Keep the direction of the pattern in mind when attaching these fabrics. The pattern calls for only one or two triangles of each of these four fabrics. Do you want to make 2 blocks? Cut more of these last 4 patches if you do.


Dark Violet 4 1½" x 10½" Medium Yellow 2 1½" x 6¼" Medium Pink 3 1½" squares Medium Violet2 1½" squares


Assembly:

Bottom of basket


Look at sketch of block and note there is

a right and a left green triangle sewn to the violet basket. Watch for up & down sense of pattern when attaching triangles. Place both green triangles right side up as shown in diagram and mark 1 ¼" down from corner. Now sew one short side of medium violet triangle to one green triangle, as shown in diagram.





Press to purple. Place second green triangle in front of you with right side up and long edge to the right. See second diagram for placement of basket unit. Sew. Press to purple.



Top of basket

Sew one yellow strip to one short side of the floral triangle right sides together. Press to floral. Sew one pink square to the end of the other yellow strip. Press to pink. Sew this unit to the other side of the top nesting the seams. Press to floral. The pink square will form the corner. The neutral triangles are attached to either side of the yellow strips using the method for the bottom of the basket. Substitute "neutral" for "green" in the instructions and "top of basket" for "violet". Press to **neutral** to allow you to nest the seams of the top and bottom halves during assembly.

Assembling the Block:

Sew the top and bottom units together, nesting the seams. Press to bottom. Trim to 10½" square. Sew a dark violet strip to two opposite side of square. Press out. Sew a pink square and a medium violet square to opposite ends of the other two dark violet strips. Press in. Lay the square and the strips on the table. Place the strips to put the *pink* squares in the top right and bottom left corners. Pin and sew. Press out. *Val Ansell 758-1185*
